At the same time I would like to congratulate all the people of Alaska for having the vision to bring the Convention into being, through the legislative assembly, in a progressive step toward Statehood. It is my misfortune that my recent return from abroad which took me through Alaska could not be scheduled so that I might have been in Fairbanks during, rather than before, the Constitutional Convention. I know it would have been a most stimulating and enjoyable experience to be with you, for, from the reports I am receiving, I am greatly impressed by the intelligence and exceptional devotion of the 49 men and 6 women gathered in Constitution Hall at the University of Alaska to take part in this historic undertaking.
