REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON STYLE AND DRAFTING Constitutional Convention Committee Proposal/6/a Style & Drafting/Article X January 30, 1956 CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF ALASKA RESOLVED, that the following be agreed upon as part of the Alaska State Constitution. ARTICLE X LOCAL GOVERNMENT Section 1. The purpose of this article is to Purpose and Construction provide for maximum local self-government with a minimum of local government units and to prevent duplication of tax-levying jurisdictions. A liberal construction shall be given to the powers of local government units. 6 Section 2. All local government powers shall be Local Government vested in boroughs and cities. The State may delegate Powers taxing powers to organized boroughs and cities only. Section 3. The entire State shall be divided into Boroughs 10 boroughs, organized or unorganized. They shall be estab-11 lished in a manner and according to standards provided 12 by law. The standards shall include geography, economy, 13 transportation and other factors. Each borough shall 14 embrace an area and population with common interests to 15 the maximum degree possible. The legislature shall Style and Drafting/Article X

classify boroughs and prescribe their powers and functions. Methods by which boroughs may be organized, incorporated, merged, consolidated, dissolved or reclassified shall be prescribed by law. Section 4. The governing body of the organized Assembly 5 borough shall be the assembly, and its composition shall be established by law or charter. Each city of the first class, and each city of any other class designated by law, shall be represented on the assembly by one or more 10 members of its council. The other members of the assembly shall be elected from and by the qualified voters 11 12 resident outside such cities. Service 13 Section 5. Service areas to provide special ser-Areas 14 vices within an organized borough may be established, altered or abolished by the assembly, subject to the 15 16 provisions of law or charter. A new service area shall 17 not be established if, consistent with the purposes of 18 this article, the new service can be provided by an 19 existing service area, by incorporation as a city, or by annexation to a city. The assembly may authorize the 20 levying of taxes, charges or assessments within a service 21 area to finance the special services. 22 Unorganized 23 Section 6. The legislature shall provide for the Boroughs 24 performance of services in unorganized boroughs, allowing for maximum local participation and responsibility. -2-

Section 7. Cities shall be incorporated in a Cities manner prescribed by law, and shall be a part of the borrough in which they are located. Cities shall have the powers and functions conferred by law or charter. They may be merged, consolidated, classified or dissolved 5 in the manner provided by law. Council Section 5. The governing body of a city shall be the council. Charters Section 9. The qualified voters of any borough of 10 the first class or city of the first class may adopt, 11 amend or repeal a home rule charter in a manner provided 12 by law. In the absence of such legislation, the govern-13 ing body of a borough or city of the first class shall 14 provide the procedure for the preparation and adoption or rejection of the charter. All charters, or parts or 15 16 amendments of charters, shall be submitted to the qual-17 ified voters of the borough or city and shall become 18 effective if approved by a majority of those who vote on 19 the specific question. Extended 20 Section 10. The legislature may extend home rule Home Rule to other boroughs and cities. 21 Home Rule 22 Section 11. A home rule borough or city may exer-Powers 23 cise all legislative powers not prohibited by law or by 24 charter. Boundaries Section 12. A local boundary commission or board

shall be established by law in the executive branch of the state government. The commission or board may consider any proposed local government boundary change. It may present proposed changes to the legislature during the first ten days of any regular session. The change shall become effective forty-five days after presentation or at the end of the session, whichever is earlier, unless disapproved by a resolution concurred in by a majority of the members of each house. The comm-10 ission or board, subject to law, may establish procedures 11 whereby boundaries may be adjusted by local action. Section 13. Agreements, including those for coop-Agreements: 12 13 erative or joint administration of any functions or 14 powers, may be made by any local government with any 15 other local government, with the State or with the United States unless otherwise provided by law or charter. 16 city may transfer to the borough in which it is located 17 18 any of its powers or functions unless prohibited by law or charter, and may in like manner revoke the transfer. 19 Section 14. An agency shall be established by law Local 20 Government 21 in the executive branch of the state government. It Agency 22 shall advise and assist local governments, review their activities, collect and publish local government infor-23 24 mation and perform other duties prescribed by law.
