## Voluntary Protection Program

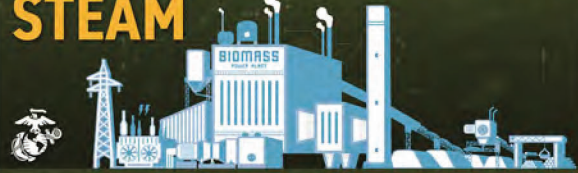


Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany is one of the safest places to work within the Department of Defense. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration recognizes MCLBA as a Voluntary Protection Program Star Worksite for its extraordinary success in preventing occupational injuries and illnesses and for continuously improving its safety program. Less than 1% of all worksites under OSHA jurisdiction achieve Star status. Our employees are fully engaged in preventing mishaps and we all look out for the health, safety and welfare of each other. Possessing the prestigious VPP Star Worksite designation is just one of the many reasons why MCLB Albany is a special place to live, work and visit.

## First DOD Net Zero Base

Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany's energy program continues to lead the Marine Corps and is the first base within the DOD to be "Net Zero". MCLB Albany now produces all electrical power needed from a 8.5 MW generator, a 4MW landfill gas generator and "smart grid" awarded under an Energy Saving Performance Contract. Combining this project with current capabilities already installed, the base is now energy resilient.

## MCLB ALBANY NET ZERO BIOMASS GENERATED STEAM

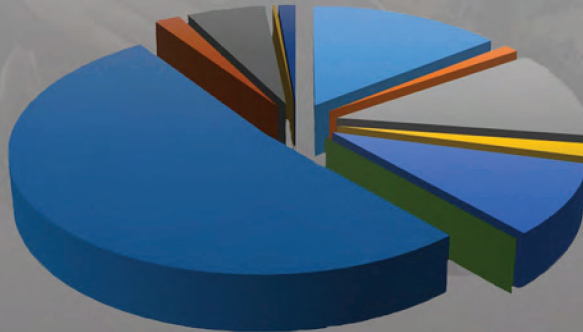


## Facilities Related Control Systems

Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany has successfully established one of the most advanced Facilities Related Control Systems programs in the Department of the Navy. Leading the way through innovative solutions; this program is saving hundreds of thousands of dollars while improving process efficiency, effectiveness and adaptability. Other efforts to connect the Maintenance Depot's paint and blast booth operation into our architecture is projected to reduce downtime by 45% and increase production by 25%.

## Message from the Commanding Officer



As the Commanding Officer of Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany, I am honored to continue building upon the exceptional relationships, energy initiatives and innovative “first” ideas that exist between the base, our tenant commands, the local community and the state of Georgia. Our strategic readiness to support future force requirements is critical to ensuring MCLB Albany continues to build upon the past 70 years of accomplishments, worldwide impact, national defense and resiliency.

MCLB Albany is one of seven installations under Marine Corps Installations East and home to Marine Corps Logistics Command, Marine Depot Maintenance Command, Marine Force Storage Command and a host of other tenants that support the warfighter. In all, more than 40 tenant organizations call our installation “home,” to include the Department of Defense’s Humanitarian Assistance Program, Georgia Army National Guard, the Albany Veterans Affairs Community-Based Outpatient Clinic and Naval Facilities Engineering Command, just to name a few.

In May 2022, MCLB Albany reached a major milestone as the first electrically “Net Zero” installation in the DOD. Net Zero is defined as the production of as much electricity from renewable “green” energy sources as it consumes from its utility provider measured during a year. The base continues to lead DOD efforts by growing our energy resiliency with future electrical vehicle support equipment, smart grid enhancements, advanced metering infrastructure, domestic hot water solar panel heating, water hardness treatment and Georgia Power solar photovoltaic connections.

Our base team, in coordination with our tenants and the local community, continue to set the bar high and serve as an example throughout the Marine Corps and DOD for being great stewards of the taxpayer dollar and as a model for community relationships for other installations to emulate. As one of the region’s largest employers, the installation plays a vital role in the economic stability of southwest Georgia and contributes to the economic health of the entire state. Additionally, our uniformed and civilian members have a long and storied history of participating in community events such as hosting JROTC cadets and volunteering for programs like Young Marines, Read Across America Day and Ties That Bind.

My team and I look forward to the next phase of strengthening our local partnerships while continuing to provide vital support to our tenants, the Marine Corps, DOD and this community. We are proud to be the only Marine Corps installation in the state of Georgia, and honored to reside alongside the great members of our southwest Georgia community.

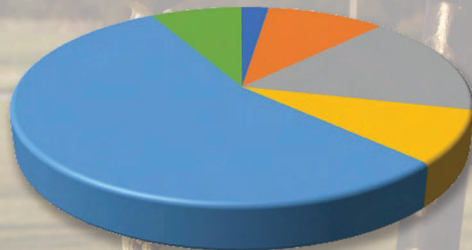

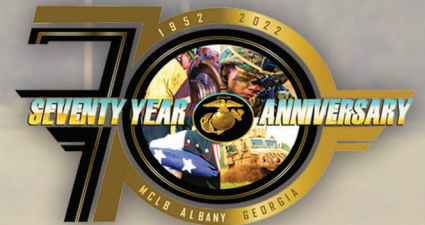

The base was commissioned in 1952 as the Marine Corps Depot of Supplies, which supplied support to Marines. Spread across 3,600 acres, MCLB Albany provides facilities, infrastructure and a range of key services, including safe haven missions for other Navy and Marine Corps bases throughout the Southeast and Gulf Coast region. The installation also serves as a staging area for Federal Emergency Management Agency, Army Corps of Engineers and other disaster relief efforts. 2022 marks 70 years for the Marines Base in Georgia.
