The city of Washington, located on land gently undulating, with just sufficient slope to insure good drainage, covers an area of 6,110.94 acres, or 366,189,546 square feet, divided thus: Area of public reservations and squares occupied by public buildings, 33,189,002 square feet; area of building lots, 121,000,214 square feet; area of alleys, 7,141,100 square feet; area of avenues, streets, open spaces, and canal, 115,767,225 square feet.

The total length of streets is 1,019,653 feet; total length of avenues, 183,797 feet; total length of streets and avenues is 1,203,450 feet.
