that the Baltimore and Alexandria
Mail Stages, which are connected with
the United States Mail Coaches Line
from Baltimore to Philadelphia, New
York, &c. - And that the Virginia mail
line from Alexandria to Fredricksburgh
Richmond, Peterburgh and Norfolk
are now in complete order, and will as
usual leave the Indian Queen, Baltimore
every morning (Sundays excepted) at
4 o'clock, and arrive in Alexandria at
4 in the afternoon. Returning, will
leave Mr Gadby's tavern, Alexandria,
at 3 o'clock every morning (Sundays
excepted) and arrive in Baltimore to
dinner, one hour before the Bank shuts.

The Accommodation Coaches, estab-
lished for the particular convenience of
our Alexandria, George Town, and
Baltimore Customers, will also leave the
Indian Queen Baltimore, every Sunday,
Tuesday and Thursday, and Mr. Gad-
by's tavern, Alexandria, every Sunday,
Wednesday and Friday, at 6 o'clock in
the morning, and arrive at the different
places of destination by 6 o'clock in the
afternoon.

cents, with an allowance of 30 wt of
baggage. - All baggage to be at the
risk of the owners.
