Sheriff's Office Involved in Youth Outreach with ACPS and NOBLE

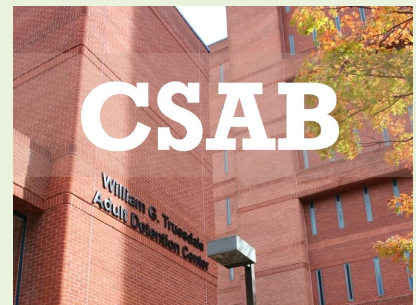
Deputies Issued Narcan, Trained to Respond to Opioid Overdoses

To help rescue overdose victims, [deputies can now carry Narcan](#), a potentially life-saving medication that can quickly reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. Deputies assigned to Judicial and Special Operations recently received training on how to respond to suspected opioid overdoses and how to use Narcan nasal spray in an emergency. These deputies, who generally work in the courthouse or in the community serving civil process, have been issued Narcan and now carry it with them.



CSAB Member Publishes Opinion Piece

Michael Strutzel, a longtime member of the Correctional Services Advisory Board, recently had a [letter to the editor published](#) in the *Alexandria Times*. The letter explored many of the programs offered to inmates while they are in the Adult Detention Center. These programs include substance abuse recovery support groups, GED and ESL classes, training for professional certifications, and courses to improve life skills and decision making, so that court ordered time in jail can be a “time for improvement.”
