


Project Background

- What we heard
 - Speeding on Montrose Avenue
 - Cut-through traffic on Montrose Avenue and other internal streets
 - Drivers not stopping for people crossing the street
- Adopted Vision Zero Action Plan, 2017
 - Key strategy is neighborhood slow zones
- Slow zones approved by City Council in March
 - Less than 25 mph, as low as 15 mph in certain districts
 - Criteria to be developed after pilot project

Neighborhood Slow Zone Pilot Project

- ✓ Draft design developed
- ✓ Information shared via flyers and neighborhood listserv
- ✓ Community feedback process underway

Pilot will assess vehicle volumes, vehicle speeds, and community feedback to inform criteria for future neighborhood slow zones.



Design Treatments



Gateway Treatments

Combination of pavement markings and custom signs to communicate slow zone



Speed Cushions

Slow vehicle speeds, discourage cutthrough traffic, and encourage stopping for pedestrians




New Crosswalks

Reduced Speed Limit?

Reduces vehicle speeds and communicates slow zone



Glebe Road Speed Management

- Speed radar signs at regular intervals on Glebe Rd
- Updates:
 - Signs have been delivered
 - Task order issued for contractor to install signs (Glebe Rd + other locations citywide)





Glebe Road Crossing Improvements

Rectangular Rapid Flashing
Beacons (RRFBs) to be installed
for uncontrolled crosswalks
across Glebe Rd at intersection
with Montrose & Ashby

>Updates:

- Signs have been delivered
- Task order issued for contractor to install signs (Glebe Rd + other locations citywide)

Glebe/Montrose/Ashby Intersection Improvements

- Upcoming large stormwater capacity project, with potential for green infrastructure
