

MONTICELLO BOULEVARD SAFETY & TRAFFIC CALMING IMPROVEMENTS

Dear Resident,

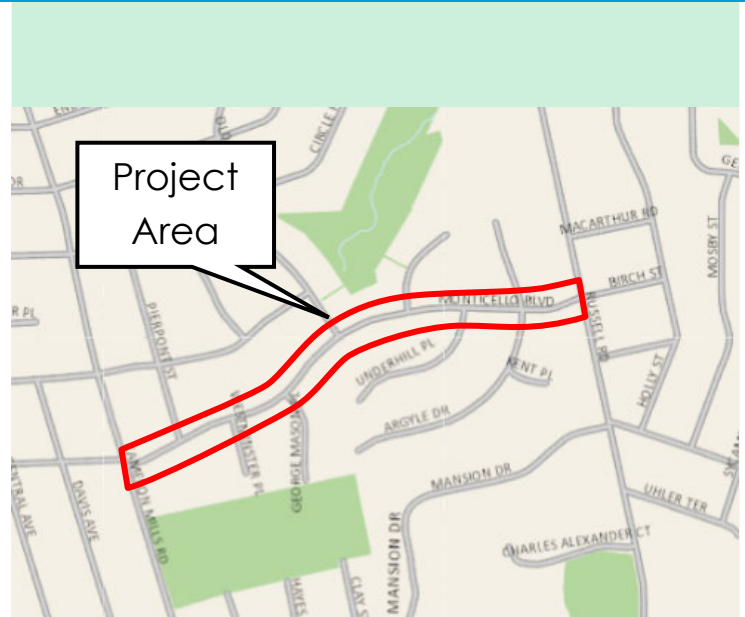
In 2018, in response to resident concerns about speeding, crossing safety, and intersection visibility, the City worked with the neighborhood to identify safety improvements on Monticello Boulevard. The changes were approved in October 2018 and include:

- New crosswalks and ADA curb ramps
- Pedestrian crossing signs
- Speed cushions to calm traffic
- A speed radar sign to deter speeding
- A new uphill bike lane
- New “no parking” areas at intersections to improve visibility

The locations for these treatments are shown on the enclosed map.

Project implementation was temporarily paused due to the reconstruction of Fire Station 203, construction for the City's municipal fiber project, the planned resurfacing of Monticello Boulevard, and the COVID-19 pandemic response.

The City anticipates repaving Monticello Boulevard in 2022 and will implement these safety measures as well.
