





DEAR MR. PRIDES

I AM VERY SORRY THAT YOU DID NOT SET TO CHICAGO FOR THE ALPHA.CON-VENTION. AS A MATTER OF FACT I ALMOST MISSED GETTING THERE MYSELF. SINCE MY GOING WAS INDEFINITE UNTIL THE LAST MOMENT, I DID NOT WRITE BECAUSE I FELT THAT YOU WOULD MAVE ALREADY DEPARTED IF YOU HAD BEEN GOING. I DID NOT ARRIVE IN CHICAGO UNTIL SUNDAY THE JOTH,

I DIE HAVE AN OPPONTUNITY TO DISCUSS AT LENGTH WITH MR. STANLEY OUR PLAN FOR THE REORGANIZATION OF DELTA PHI DELTA. AS I HAD ANTICIPATED, HE WAS MOST RECEPTIVE TO THE PLAN AND IS WILLING TO LEND HIS SUPPONT TO THE IDEA AS FAR AS THE NEGRO PUBLISHERS ASSOCIATION IS CONCENTED.

IN A PREVIOUS LETTER YOU MENTIONED THE POSSIBILITY OF HAVING ME COME TO JEFFERSON CITY TO ADDRESS THE STUDENT BODY. YOU WILL RECALL THAT I SUGGESTED THAT YOU ALSO ASK MR. STAMLEY TO COME AT THE SAME TIME. HE HAS ASKED THAT I SAY TO YOU THAT HE WOULD BE HAPPY TO SHARE THE PLANNED OCCASION WITH ME AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NMPA. THIS WOULD ENTAIL NO EXPENSE ON YOUR PART.

IF I MAY I WOULD LIKE TO SUGGEST THAT, IF YOUR PROGRAM WILL PERMIT, YOU PLAN THE MEETINGS AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE. ONCE YOU, FRANK AND I ARE ABLE TO GET TOGETHER WE WOULD BE ABLE TO LAY THE PLANS FOR THE NEW ORGANIZATION. THEN WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO CALL A CONVENTION FOR LATE SPRING; THUS WE WOULD BE ABLE TO LAUNCH THE ORGANIZATION WITH FULL FORCE IN THE FALL.

I REGRET THAT WE WERE NOT ABLE TO GET TO CHICAGO. HOWEVER, IF WE ARE ABLE TO MEET SOME TIME IN THE NEAR FUTURE, IT MAY BE POSSIBLE TO MOVE ON THE PROJECT THIS SCHOOL YEAR.


