Annual Plan

- One year
- Projects to fulfill goals
- Budgets money for activities

CAPER

- Reports on accomplishments
- Tracks progress toward goals

Programs

- Transitional Assistance Program (CDBG) assists low-income residents with security deposits and first month's rent
- Winter Shelter (CDBG) provides overnight shelter to unhoused people during the winter months
- Home Rehabilitation Loan Program (CDBG) assists low-income homeowners with repairs to extend the useful life of their home
- ❖ Rental Property Rehabilitation Program (CDBG) assists non-profit affordable rental properties with rehabilitation and repairs of common areas and building infrastructure
- ❖ Flexible Homebuyer Assistance Program (HOME) provides down-payment and closing cost assistance to income-qualified first-time homebuyer



CDBG funded programs

- ❖9% of those assisted identified as Hispanic or Latino/a
- ❖99% of those assisted were extremely low-income
- ❖83.5% of those assisted received overnight shelter

Other Accomplishments

- Construction began on the Seminary Rd townhouses
- Pendleton StRooming Housereceived \$850,000CPF grant
- Witter Place received \$3.4 million in DHCD funding
