"APRIL IS NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH"

- WHEREAS, our children are our most valuable resources and are vital to the future success, prosperity, and quality of life of American Samoa. Today, they are also our most vulnerable citizens; and
- WHEREAS, every child deserves a safe, stable, and nurturing home in communities they need to foster their healthy growth and development; and
- WHEREAS, 321 reports were made to child protective services in 2021-2022; and
- WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect is a serious problem that affects every segment of our community, and finding solutions requires input and action from everyone; and
- WHEREAS, child abuse can have long-term psychological, emotional, and physical effects that have lasting consequences for victims of abuse; and
- WHEREAS, protective factors are conditions that reduce or eliminate risk and promote the social, emotional, and developmental well-being of children; and
- WHEREAS, effective child abuse prevention activities succeed because of the partnerships created between child welfare professionals, education, health, community-and faith-based organizations, businesses, law enforcement, and families; and
- WHEREAS, communities must make every effort to promote programs and activities that create strong and thriving children and families; and
- WHEREAS, we acknowledge that we must work together as a community to increase awareness about child abuse and contribute to promote the social and emotional well-being of children and families in a safe, stable, and nurturing environment; and
- WHEREAS, prevention remains the best defense for our children and families.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEMANU P. S. MAUGA, Governor of the Territory of American Samoa, do hereby proclaim the Month of April 2023 as CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH in our Territory. I call upon everyone in American Samoa to observe this month by joining together to promote the safety and well-being of all children and families, to honor the strength and resilience of adult survivors of child abuse, and to recognize the child-welfare workforce and allies who work tirelessly to protect our children.
