2023 is nearly over. We have been in the Angel Wing just a little over 3 years. It is so wonderful to have such an awesome facility to help animals. Our community has supported Angels and made this possible.

The plan to have this amazing facility available to our future residents is a good one! Unlike most charities, this one has the capability to "earn" income so it does not have to depend on donations



alone. It has been the plan since 1990 when Angels for Animals was founded.

Some of you can remember making pies in the basement of Locust Grove Church. How about the crazy three day garage sales at the CallaMar? Our animal power has relied on man (mostly woman) power. It still does.

Our main struggle is to find staffing. We need doctors, registered veterinary technicians, receptionists, vet assistants and dedicated volunteers. In the past year with the interesting animal situation, we have learned the value of effective adoption managers.

Like our economy, the animal scene is really changing. Angels did a great job educating the public. There are no longer thousands of puppies and kittens born in the general population. The available pets come from very bad situations of hoarding and abuse, and sadly, there are still some very ignorant people out there. Shelters are no longer buried in super adoptable pets. These sad pet situations have always been there at the bottom of the "animal pile." They are just coming to the surface now.

Now that the light has shed on the situations, there are more pets relieved of their lives of suffering. The down side for us is these pets are more difficult to place in homes.

Angels is always going to be here doing all we can to help animals owned and abandoned. The bottom line is having the people who wish to give their time, talent and donations.

We decided to bring her into our office, where we usually keep declawed cats who come to us looking for forever homes. Mary decided she was boss of the area from day one. Winter Weather is Coming - Cold Weather Safety Tips for Pets

Most of us are aware that there are risks and dangers associated with summer and warm weather. Wintertime

and cold weather have risks that pet owners should be aware of as well. Wellness care is a concern. Are they up to date on vaccines and preventative medications? Extreme weather conditions both hot or cold can be a stressor on a pet so making sure they are healthy is a great idea. Always have your veterinary clinic and an emergency vet phone numbers available in case they are needed. Make sure you have an adequate supply of your pet's medications in case the weather is bad and you are unable to get to the vet. Prepare an emergency kit, and include your pet in your plans. Have enough food, water and medicine (including any prescription



If weather becomes extreme, stay inside . Pets can be susceptible to frostbite and hypothermia just like people,

and should not be exposed to freezing temperature for long periods. Some dogs were bred for colder environments, but even they should not be left outside in freezing weather for long periods.

Before starting your vehicle make some noise. Knock on the fenders and the hood of your car before starting it. Small animals, and cats, especially, like to get up in the warm engine compartment to stay warm if outside in the cold weather. Making some noise will get them out of harm's way before you start the car and injure or potentially kill a small animal. Make sure to check pet's feet when

medications as well as heartworm and flea/tick preventives) on hand to get through at least 5 days.

Your pet's tolerance to the cold may vary based on age, body condition and health status. Older or elderly pets may have lower tolerance to the cold due to arthritis, and some diseases interfere with your pet's ability to regulate their temperature well. Short legged animals may need snow removal in an area of the yard to make bathroom time outside easier. Animals can get slip-and-fall injuries just like we do, so watch for ice.





they come inside. Ice can collect between the toes of long haired animals and cause lameness and pain. If they were in an area that has ice melt or salt wash the feet with warm water and pat dry. Pets may lick these substances and it can cause GI upset or make them very ill. There are pet friendly alternatives for ice melt so try to use those around your home. Antifreeze is sweet tasting and pets may lick it. Antifreeze can cause kidney damage and possible death if ingested. Make sure to clean up antifreeze spills well. With a little planning you and your pet can enjoy a great winter season.





Consider Donating a Portion of Your IRA Required Minimum Distribution

If you are 73, you might be receiving a Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA each year. The RMD is considered ordinary income and is taxed at an individual's tax rate. If these funds are donated directly to Angels for Animals, which is a 501(c)(3) organization, they are not treated as income to the donor by the IRS up to a maximum of \$100,000 per year. If your tax consultant determines this is appropriate for your situation, please contact Janet Flynn at 330-716-0697 to make the necessary arrangements.

Naming Angels for Animals in Your Will

Over the years Angels for Animals has received bequests from long time volunteers, donors and animal lovers. Their names can be seen as you tour the Angel Wing, above doorways and on the exterior of the building. 

The Fall Shed by Diane Less

Fall is a time of change. Fall changes to Winter. The leaves change color and fall from the trees. With the holiday around the corner, Fall can become a very stressful time. Even without the extra expense of the holidays, in our current economy, everyday costs are

out of control. Prices on essentials such as medical expenses, food, utilities and fuel have skyrocketed. Pets have quickly become a luxury, and for many, unaffordable.

Here at Angels for Animals, we believe pets are family. They should not be considered expendable. In the Fall.



some people feel they need to "shed" the family pet. "Get rid of" is a statement that makes me cringe. Although "dumping" your family pet at a shelter is unethical, it is not illegal. So many of the "shedders" are the ones who dampen the headway shelters make in placing animals into homes.

Saving abandoned or surrendered animals is also expensive. A shelter takes on all of the costs of these animals. The cost of the "shed" is passed on to the shelter that is already burdened with the expense of taking care of stray animals. To make matters worse, donations coming into the shelter are down. Although times are hard, animals still need our help. Strays need to be trapped and brought in from the cold and then spayed or neutered.

The "Feline Fix Fest" is your opportunity to make things better in 2024. This program has a goal to spay or neuter 3,000 cats for \$20.00 each in January and February. These cats would have babies in March otherwise. Each cat can produce 30 offspring in one season if not fixed. You can "sponsor" one cat for \$40.00 which will cover our cost. 
Angels For Animals Partners in Veterinary Technician Program with Eastern Gateway Community College by Stacy Pierce

is truly exhausting but we have alot of fun too!


