Seven members, each from a different county, appointed by the Governor:

Notes: Each year the Governor shall appoint a member to serve as Chair. The Chair may be reappointed. Council members shall serve staggered three-year terms beginning and ending on the third Monday in January. Initial members shall be appointed as follows: (1) five county-representative members, chosen by lot, shall be appointed by the Governor to terms of office expiring January 21, 2013. On the expiration of the terms of these members, replacement members shall be appointed as follows: (a) three members shall be appointed by the Governor to full terms of office; (b) one member shall be appointed by the President of the Senate to a full term of office; (c) one member shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to a full term of office. (2) five

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county-representative members, chosen by lot, shall be appointed by the Governor to terms of office expiring January 20, 2014. On the expiration of the terms of these members, replacement members shall be appointed as follows: (a) three members shall be appointed by the Governor to full terms of office; (b) one member shall be appointed by the President of the Senate to a full term of office; (c) one member shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to a full term of office. (3) five county-representative members, chosen by lot, plus the representative of an economic development organization and the member representing Indian tribes, shall be appointed by the Governor to terms of office expiring January 19, 2015. On the expiration of the terms of the county-representative members, replacement members shall be appointed as follows: (a) three members shall be appointed by the Governor to full terms of office; (b) one member shall be appointed by the President of the Senate to a full term of office; (c) one member shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to a full term of office. Laws 2021, Chapter 285 struck the repeal date of 7/1/21. No end date now.
