All other monies appropriated to the department in this act may not be spent for personal 32 services or employee-related expenditures or for maintenance contracts on 33 34 building components and equipment without review by the joint committee on 35 capital review. 36 B. Except as provided in subsection A of this section, the monies 37 appropriated in this act may not be spent for personal services or employee-related expenditures of state employees, excluding any services 38 39 provided as part of the inmate construction program for correctional 40 facilities.
