Attorney General Mayes Absent at Key Executive Oversight Hearing Amidst Allegations of Misconduct

STATE CAPITOL, PHOENIX – State Representative Jacqueline Parker, Chairwoman of the House Ad Hoc Committee on Executive Oversight (CEO), released a statement on Attorney General Kris Mayes’ refusal to appear before the Committee and address allegations of her misuse of office and refusal to defend state laws.

“This Committee is tasked with exercising oversight over all Executive branch officers and specifically, investigating allegations that the Attorney General has abused and exceeded her legal authority. We have repeatedly extended an open-ended invitation to Attorney General Mayes to testify at any committee meeting. It is reasonable to expect that she should address the Committee’s concerns. Instead, she has resorted to disparaging the work of this Committee and has chosen to respond to our invitation through press conferences, telling reporters she has no intention of cooperating or participating. I am hopeful she will listen to the very real concerns that many members of the public and this institution have raised about her abuses of office and refusal to perform duties imposed by law.”

Jacqueline Parker is a Republican member of the Arizona House of Representatives serving Legislative District 15, which includes East Mesa, Queen Creek, and San Tan Valley.
