
eBooks on Your Kindle


1. Navigate to http://www.baldwinlib.org/ebooks and click on the link "click here to access OverDrive eBooks".




2. That will take you to the main OverDrive website. Click "Sign In" in the upper right hand corner.




3. Sign in by choosing "Baldwin Public Library" from the drop down menu and entering your library card number, or by logging in with an existing OverDrive or Facebook account.




4. Once you are logged in, you can search for books several different ways. Clicking on the search button (below, red arrow) will pull up a search box where you can search by title or author.




5. You can also browse for titles by subject or format (eBook or eAudiobook). To access those options , click the "Subjects" or "Collections" menu, respectively.




6. Below is a screenshot of one set of search results. Click the "Borrow" link. If the title is unavailable, you may place the item on hold by clicking the "Place a Hold" link.




7. You will then see the gold banner below. Click the "Loans" link (red arrow, below) to proceed.




8. From the "Choose a Format" drop down menu, select "Kindle Book".




9. You will then be directed to Amazon's webpage. Click on "Get library book". You will then need to log in to Amazon with the same account that was used to register your Kindle.




10. After logging in to Amazon.com, you will be presented with your options for receiving the book. From the drop down menu, select the Kindle you wish to read the book on and then click "Continue".



11. You will then see a screen confirming that you have successfully checked out your Kindle book. The book will automatically be transferred to your Kindle the next time it is turned on and connected to a Wi-Fi network.



12. If your Kindle is not connected to a Wi-Fi network, you will need to connect to one. To do so, tap on the main menu icon to expand its options.* Note that library ebooks will not transfer over a 3G wireless network; you must connect to Wi-Fi.






Note that if you have a Kindle DX, you will need to transfer library titles to your device via USB.


13. Select "Turn on wireless" from the menu.





14. If you are not presented with a list of Wi-Fi networks to connect to, pull up the main menu again, and tap on "Settings".






15. Then tap on "Wi-Fi Networks".



16. You should then be presented with a list of nearby Wi-Fi networks to join. Tap the network you wish to connect to, and enter the password (if necessary).



17. Once you have connected to the network, you will see "Wi-Fi" in your top status bar, and your title should automatically begin to download, and will show up in your device library.
