and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a

Brunswick UMC Family and Friends,

There have been a lot of changes in the UMC in recent months and I know that these changes have caused anxiety for many of you. Let me specifically address two concerns: the appointment of clergy who identify as LGBTQ+ and same sex marriages. Soon after the General Conference, Bishop Malone recorded a video in which she addresses both of these issues and assures congregations that nothing will be forced on them. Please take time to watch the video so you can hear about these changes straight from the top. Essentially, Bishop Malone assures all of us that the conference will not force a clergy person who identifies as part of the LGBTQ+ community to serve a church that is not ready for such an appointment. The Conference and the UMC will also not force a congregation to allow same sex unions in their church. That decision will be made by the local church. Within our congregation, any decisions about these items would be made through the Leadership Board which functions both as Staff Parish Relations Committee and Administrative Council. I hope that these facts ease some of your worries.

That having been said, I really want to share with you some things that are happening in our church. The first week of June, I went on the youth mission trip to Lumberton, N.C. where we worked to repair flood damaged homes. We took 15 youth and 6 adults. Many of the youth who attended don't really have much of a background in church. They came because someone invited them.

These unchurched kids represent a huge percentage of all the youth and young adults in our community. Just getting them involved was a huge win for our mission of growing disciples for Jesus Christ.

As the week went on and our group grew closer, I began to hear these kids identify themselves with the Brunswick UMC. One girl, who had never really gone to church before, called us "her church." I continued to hear this kind of sentiment throughout the week. Kids are beginning to identify with our church because BUMC has become one of their "safe places" where they can be authentic and true to themselves while exploring their spiritual selves and growing closer to God.

All of this is happening in a world where many youth and young adults are distancing themselves from church because of the hate-filled and angry messages they receive from purported "Christians" on the internet, on social media, and in the news. Clearly our group of kids did not receive that message from our church and that is wonderful news. However, I do need to say that many youth and young adults consider themselves to be allies of the LGBTQ+ community. They have friends and loved ones who identify as part of that community and a large percentage of youth will not be part of any church that devalues a person because of who they love. What I'm saying here, is that the recent changes at General Conference to remove all restrictions against those who identify as LGBTQ+ are one of the reasons that a lot of these kids feel welcome and safe among us.

Let me end this by reiterating my message of inclusiveness. We have always known that many of us have differing opinions about theology, politics, and many other topics. In the past, we have been able to love each other regardless of differences. I hope that going forward we will continue to do that. First and foremost, each one of us is a beloved child of God. Each one of us is here to serve Jesus Christ, to make disciples, and to share Jesus's love to all people.

I hope we can set aside our differing opinions and Biblical interpretations and follow the example of Jesus in our scripture above. If we simply love God with everything we have and love others as much as ourselves, then all the rest will fall into place.

Finance Report

The finances of our Church continue to hold steady. Monthly giving is at a level that allows us to meet salary, pay the bills, and fund our missions and ministries, but the checking account continues to have a fairly low balance. At the end of May, our checking balance was \$16,675.73 which is not a lot considering the monthly cost of running our church.

We are very blessed to have some reserve funds in various investments. Our money market account at Huntington Bank held \$44,148.80 at the end of May. Much of this money is part of our building and maintenance funds and so is restricted to those uses. We also have an investment account with the Methodist Foundation of Ohio which held \$96,169.76 at the end of May. This is a sort of savings account should we encounter a need for more funds. Our church has an endowment fund of \$12,456.84 with the Foundation which is also restricted in its possible uses. Finally, the proceeds from the sale of the parsonage have grown to \$266,506.34. This money is also invested at the Foundation and we are required by the rules of the UMC to hold onto these funds for 5 years after the sale of the parsonage.

In summary: God is good and God's creation is a place of abundant resources. We have decent money put away and invested while still having enough given on a monthly basis to cover the costs of all our missions and ministries. But, it would be good to see a bump in our regular giving. Please prayerfully consider your finances and consider giving more, or beginning to give if you don't already.

Annual Conference 2024 Report

I was the lay delegate to the 55th session of Annual Conference which was held at the John S Knight Center in Akron. For those who are unaware of what Annual Conference is, it's the annual business meeting of all the churches within the East Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church. Delegates are made up of all clergy, as well as lay delegates from each church, and this year approximately 640 voting members were in attendance. Representing our church was Pastor Matt, Pastor Susan and myself.

The experience of the conference is centered around taking care of the business of the church, as well as connecting and re-connecting with others, communal worship, and hearing inspiring messages from a variety of speakers. The theme was "Faith, Hope, Love" based on Isaiah 40:30 "... but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

During the conference's services and celebrations, we remembered church leaders who passed away, celebrated retirements as well as commissioning and ordination of clergy. Throughout the week many reports were shared about the great things our members are doing throughout East Ohio to help make disciples of Jesus Christ in our communities.

During our business sessions, the conference approved the variety of committee reports for the year including one presented by Pastor Matt as the chair of the board of benefits. We approved a few issues including a 5% increase to pastors earning the minimum salaries, several resolutions dealing with our commitments to promote peace, assisting those in our communities who are in need of affordable housing, and a resolve to welcome all people into our church family.

Within the past several years, the conference as well as the United Methodist Church as a whole, has been working to reorganize for the purpose of efficiency and to utilize finances better. Earlier this year, the conference has reduced the number of districts down to 4. Our church is now a part of the Western Plains District. The General Conference also has announced that starting in September, the East and West Ohio Conferences will both be served by one bishop.

Another decision that was made is one we are very familiar with. Many churches including our own has gone to the single board model, and all 4 new districts have also begun operating in this way. We voted to align the conference governance in this new board model allowing East Ohio to function more effectively and efficiently.

Finally, the best part of the conference are the inspiring messages brought to us by the many speakers, musicians, and prayers throughout the week. The focus was centered on renewing our strength as we are running the race God set before us, and exploring what we, pastors and laity alike, can do to take care of ourselves in order to be most effective in ministry.

A Message from Karen McGoughran

Change is hard especially when you have been a part of something for so long. I've been a member of BUMC since 1994 and obviously things are changing here and for all United Methodist Churches... but is it really?

Before I started working here, I don't think I even knew there was a Book of Discipline. During my time working in the church office, the only times we had to refer to the Book of Discipline were during Administrative Council meetings when we needed to check a procedure. So, for me, nothing really is changing directly to me as a member here at this church.

Being a member of this church or any church for that matter allows me to have an extended family. They are my support system and my friends. Some of them I even consider to be my sisters and brothers and working in the church office has also brought me extra moms and dads. Just as in any family there are differences in opinions. My brother, Keith and I have very different viewpoints on religion, and we interpret the Bible scriptures differently. I listen to his viewpoints, and I share my viewpoints with him, and we both continue to believe differently. I don't disown him or turn my back on him because he doesn't believe the same way I do. Why would I do that to my church family?

I come to church on a Sunday morning to worship God. I love the hymns and singing God's praises. I pray to God and listen to the sermon. Sometimes I can really relate to the sermon and sometimes I can't. Sometimes I can hear God speaking to me and sometimes I don't. But I always leave church fulfilled because I worshiped God and I got to see my church family. None of that is changing for me. Just because the Book of Discipline will be revised, that doesn't change my Sunday morning and my membership in this church.

The only thing that is changing, is that our United Methodist Church globally is now saying in the Book of Discipline that we should be accepting and loving to EVERYONE. Which is what Jesus taught us all along... (John 13:34-35) "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." We should have been doing this all along.

Jesus teaches us to go out and make disciples. How are we to do that if we're excluding people from our church? What does that communicate to non-Christians? We have been alienating an entire population of people. Whether you believe homosexuality is a sin or not, doesn't change the fact that we as Christians are supposed to love Everyone. We are supposed to be bringing people to Christ. How do we expect a middle schooler or high school child to become a Christian when we're communicating that they are not worthy of our love or Christ's love because they are living a different life than what we agree with.

I am hearing a lot of opinions regarding this change and some of you are leaving our church, even after you've been here for over 50 years. It is really sad to see and breaks my heart. I ask you to think about what is actually changing for you personally. Are you willing to give up lifelong relationships because you don't agree with the changes to the Book of Discipline that I am assuming you have probably never read. Would you leave your own family because of a difference of opinion?

I don't expect my opinion to change your minds if you are considering leaving our church, but I do ask you to just consider my questions. Dig deep and pray about it. Maybe it's time to change your way of thinking. We should never be too old or "stuck in our ways" to grow in our Christian faith.

I pray for each of you and for our church. There are some really good things happening here and we can continue to do even greater things with everyone's support and willingness to live out what Jesus has taught us, Love your neighbor as your yourself.
