Describe Present and Original Physical Construction and Appearance.

The Halvorson Mound Group currently consists of three effigy mounds located in Yahara Heights County Park, Dane County, Wisconsin. These include a panther and bear effigy and an oval mound. The mounds are now located within a woodlot at the northern end of Yahara County Park. Past descriptions indicate that this group originally contained five mounds.

Charles E. Brown first recorded this mound group along with the Reverend F. A. Gilmore on July 20, 1911 (Brown 1912a). Brown (1912a) reports the presence of three effigies, an oval, and a linear mound. Brown (1912b) next described the mound group as being located on the Halvorson Farm on the north side of the Yahara River, and consisting of three effigies and an oval mound. The mounds are separated by 200-300 feet, and are located in a pasture with scattered clumps of oak trees. The individual mounds are described as follows (Figure 1):

- 1) A panther effigy 228 feet long and ca. 2.5 feet high, the head pointing north, located within 35 feet of the river bank.
- 2) Similar to the panther effigy mound, but lacking the long, tapering caudal assemblage. This mound is 85 feet long, and 17 feet wide at its widest.
- 3) An oval mound 50 feet long, 30 feet wide, and three feet high.
- 4) A wildcat/lynx, with a length from head to tail of 144 feet. The tail is 40 feet long, the legs are 28.25 feet and 31 feet long, the body is 20 feet across at its widest, and the mound is about 2.5 feet high.

A single linear mound (the fifth mound mentioned in Brown 1912a) is described as being located on an elevation "hundreds of feet north" of this mound group (Brown 1912b). It is described as being 210 feet long, 18 feet wide, and 1.5 feet high. The mound is oriented northeast to southwest, and is surrounded by oak trees (Brown 1912b).

By 1979, Peterson (1979) and Salkin (1983) reported that only the panther and bear effigies still remained. Peterson described the panther as Brown's Mound No. 1. It had a length of almost 200 feet and a height of almost 2 feet, with the mound having two small potholes in the body area. The second surviving mound is a bear effigy, most probably Brown's Mound No. 2. This mound is about 72 feet long and 20 inches high, with a single pothole in its body.

Johns (n.d.) next mapped the mound group as part of the Dane County Indian Mounds Identification Project (Figure 2). He reports that the effigy mounds are in the same condition as they were in 1979, although now a large pothole is present near the head of the panther mound. Johns (n.d.) was also able to locate what he felt to be a remnant of Brown's oval mound No. 3. The two other mounds are thought to have been destroyed by agricultural activities prior to the 1970s (Johns n.d.).


Significance of Nominated Property and Conformance to Designation Criteria:

The Halvorson Mound Group contains at least two well preserved effigies out of a total of five original mounds located on the north shore of the Yahara River, in the Yahara Heights County Park, Dane County, Wisconsin. The two effigy mounds appear to be in the same condition as when they were first described in 1912 (Brown 1912b). In addition, a small remnant of the oval may be present, while the final two mounds have been destroyed. Aboriginal mounds derive their significance from their shape, location within a group, and the deposits within them. The extant mounds within the Halvorson Mound Group retain sufficient integrity to yield significant information on the Late Woodland Stage of Madison's prehistory.

The mounds date to the Late Woodland Effigy Mound Tradition based on their similarity with other dated mound types. The mounds retain a great deal of integrity individually, and represent the last intact members of a larger group. As such, the site is likely to yield information important to prehistory. Potential areas of research include the dating of mound construction, the function of effigy mounds and mound groups, the role of mound groups within the Late Woodland socio-economic systems, and the meaning of the mounds within the Late Woodland world view.

NOTE: While the entire parcel is nominated as a Madison Landmark, it is the intent of this nomination to protect only the Indian mounds and their environs. Therefore, building permits and other land disturbances will be reviewed by the Landmarks Commission only for an area within 100 feet of the boundaries of the mound group as shown on Figure 2.
