Dear Adult Safety Net (ASN) Program Providers,

Beginning on August 1, 2023, the ASN Program will no longer offer pneumococcal conjugate (PCV20), pneumococcal polysaccharide (PPSV23), varicella (VAR), and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines from its current vaccine formulary.

ASN providers may use any remaining stock of these four vaccines for eligible populations but will no longer be able to order additional doses. ASN Program providers must continue to update doses administered and vaccine inventory in Vaccine Allocation and Ordering System (VAOS) for these four vaccines until inventory is depleted.

Based on a review of current funding and vaccine demand, removal of these four vaccines from formulary will allow the ASN Program to operate within available funds.

The updated ASN Program vaccine formulary includes:

- Hepatitis A (Hep A);
- Hepatitis B (Hep B);
- Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B (Hep A-Hep B) combination;
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- Meningococcal Conjugate (MCV4);
- Tetanus and Diphtheria Toxoids (Td); and
- Tetanus and Diphtheria Toxoids and Acellular Pertussis (Tdap).

As a reminder, only individuals 19 years of age or older who do not have health insurance are eligible for vaccination under the ASN program. Individuals are not eligible to receive ASN vaccines if they are enrolled in Medicare, Medicaid, other health insurance, or are covered by another program.
