Guided by the basic principle that sustainable economic development should be locally-driven, EDA partners with communities and regions to build capacity based on local conditions and needs.

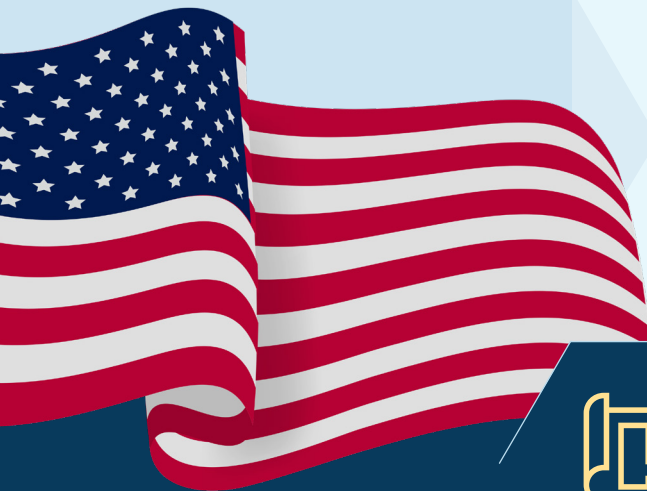
Through its network of regionally based staff and portfolio of flexible grant tools, **EDA helps communities take control of their future and position themselves for economic prosperity and resiliency.**

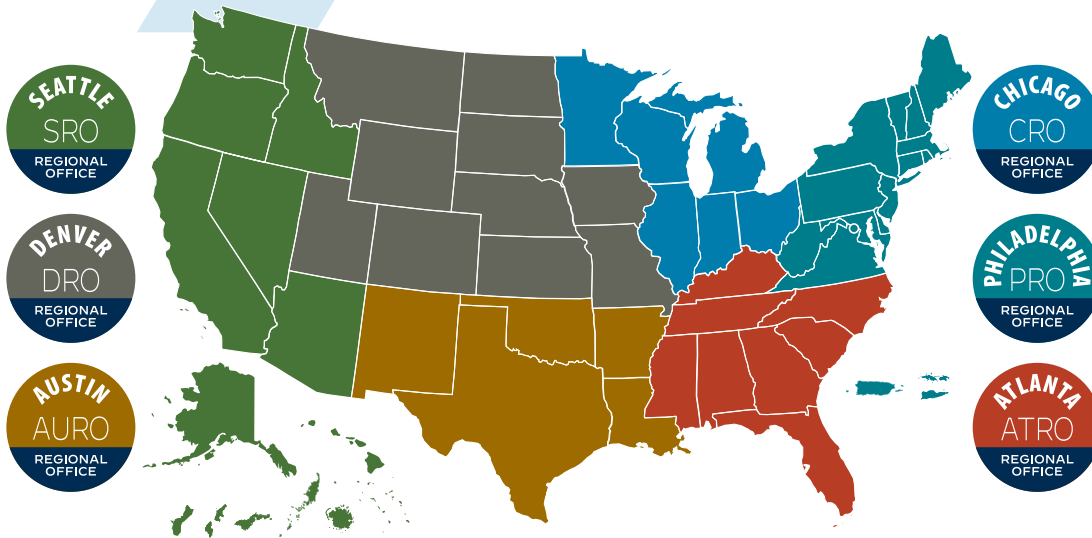
