DEL MONTE VOLUNTARY NONPARTISAN  
GOOD GOVERNMENT FUND

I. Background

A. Overview

This report covers an audit of the Del Monte Voluntary Nonpartisan Good Government Fund ("the Committee"), undertaken by the Audit Division of the Federal Election Commission in accordance with the Commission's audit policy to determine whether there has been compliance with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The audit was conducted pursuant to Section 438(a)(8) of Title 2 of the United States Code, which directs the Commission to make from time to time audits and field investigations with respect to reports and statements filed under the provisions of the Act.

The Committee registered with the United States House of Representatives on July 10, 1972. The purpose of the Committee is to support legislators who will support the views of big business. The Committee maintains its headquarters in San Francisco, California.

The audit covered the period from January 1, 1977 through October 31, 1979, the final coverage date of the most recent report filed by the Committee at the time of the audit. The Committee reported a beginning cash balance on January 1, 1977 of \$395.81, total receipts for the period of \$18,246.00, total expenditures for the period of \$17,998.47 and a closing cash balance on October 31, 1979 of \$643.34.

This audit report is based on documents and working papers which support each of the factual statements. They form part of the record upon which the Commission based its decisions on the matters in this report and were available to Commissioners and appropriate staff for review.

B. Key Personnel

C. Scope

The audit included such tests as verification of total reported receipts and expenditures and individual transactions; review of required supporting documentation and analysis of Committee debts and obligations; and, such other audit procedures as deemed necessary under the circumstances.

II. Findings and Recommendation

Based upon examination of the reports and statements filed and the records presented by the Del Monte Voluntary Nonpartisan Good Government Fund, no material problems in complying with the Federal Election Campaign Act were discovered during the course of the audit.
