REPORT OF THE AUDIT DIVISION  
ON THE  
GENERAL TELEPHONE AND ELECTRONICS  
CORPORATION GOOD GOVERNMENT CLUB

I. Background

A. Overview

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This report is based on an audit of the General Telephone and Electronics Corporation Good Government Club ("the Committee"), undertaken by the Audit Division of the Federal Election Commission in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The audit was conducted pursuant to Section 438(b) of Title 2 of the United States Code which states, in part, that the Commission may conduct audits and field investigations of any political committee required to file a report under section 434 of this title. Prior to conducting any audit under this subsection, the Commission shall perform an internal review of reports filed by selected committees to determine if the reports filed by a particular committee meet the threshold requirements for substantial compliance with the Act.

The Committee registered with the Federal Election Commission on July 1, 1975 as the General Telephone and Electronics Stamford Employees Good Government Club. On November 9, 1979, the Committee amended its statement of organization to change its name to General Telephone and Electronics Good Government Club. On May 20, 1980, the Committee amended its statement of organization to change its name to General Telephone and Electronics Corporation Good Government Club. The Committee maintains its headquarters in Stamford, Connecticut.

The audit covered the period January 1, 1981 through December 31, 1982. The Committee reported a cash balance on January 1, 1981 of \$10,018.94; total receipts of \$153,422.34; total disbursements of \$158,685.18; and a cash balance on December 31, 1982 of \$4,756.10.

This audit report is based on documents and work papers which support each of its factual statements. They form part of the record upon which the Commission based its decisions on the matters in the report and were available to the Commissioners and appropriate staff for review.

B. Key Personnel

The Treasurers of the Committee during the period covered by the audit were Mr. Marvin L. Myrick from January 1, 1981 through June 1, 1981; Ms. Gladys K. Furphy from June 1, 1981 through October 19, 1982; and Ms. Claire Donohue from October 19, 1982 through the close of the audit period.

C. Scope

The audit included such tests as verification of total reported receipts and disbursements and individual transactions; review of required supporting documentation; analysis of Committee debts and obligations; and such other audit procedures as deemed necessary under the circumstances.

II. Finding and Recommendation

Based upon examination of the reports and statements filed and the records presented by the Committee, no material problems in complying with the Federal Election Campaign Act were discovered during the course of the audit.

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
