Voting Record Scorecard for the 117th Congress — First Session

Dear FEW Members:

We are thrilled to present this report of the 117th United States Congress voting record. The 117th Congress convened in Washington, D.C. beginning January 3, 2021, and ended on January 3, 2022, representing the conclusion of the presidency of Donald J. Trump and the beginning of the Presidency of Joseph R. Biden Jr. Three new Senators were sworn into Congress on or before January 20, 2021, and all 435 seats of the House of Representatives were filled at the conclusion of the election in November 2020.

This Federally Employed Women (FEW) Scorecard Report contains the five recorded votes that were acted upon by the United States House of Representatives and one recorded vote in the United States Senate. Based on these votes, FEW rates each lawmaker based on their actual recorded vote on bills that are identified within our three-tier Legislative Agenda. Scores are based on legislation that will either impact federally employed women, the federal workforce, or issues that align with a FEW's position. We also highlighted Members of Congress who received hearings in committees or votes in the House of Representatives on legislation that aligns with our goals.

There are no words that can express how thankful we are to the Members of Congress that voted for the FEW initiatives in our agenda. We are appreciative of their support and we are even more thankful to our members for their dedication and advocacy engagement. This helps us win.

Note: This Report is based on current legislation sent before Congress during this period in time. This list does not include all the legislators who have been and continue to support the issues that are important to FEW.

I hope that everyone reading this Report knows how important your awareness of decisions being made and brought before Congress are to you. That is why FEW provides this Report for your use in examining the past voting records of your Congressional Member of Congress and to inquire about the details behind their vote. This is another tool for you to use to speak with your legislator about their voting record. Let your representative know that you agree or disagree with the decisions regarding their votes and co-sponsorships of legislation that affect your employment, your health, and overall wellness. While this voting record is an important tool for your use in monitoring the actions of Congress, it should not be used as the sole reflection of a legislator's record. Therefore, this Report is neither an endorsement nor a condemnation of any Member of Congress's support.

I am very proud of the advocacy work of FEW members to move our Legislative Agenda forward. Although we are in unusual times with COVID-19 still looming, FEW has not stopped using our voice to support you. This term brought forth a major achievement from our Legislative Agenda with the passage of the 2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) enacted on January 1, 2021, which extended provisions of the Federal Employee Paid Leave Act (FEPLA). The 2021 NDAA helped us gain up to 12 weeks of paid leave and it expands paid parental leave coverage to several previously excluded federal workers and it applies to any birth, adoption, or foster placement occurring on or after October 1, 2020. As I conclude my term in office, I want us to remember that FEW is here as a premiere resource to provide information to help you make educated decisions and your membership helps strengthen FEW's footprint to make a bigger impact in supporting legislation that supports us.

The only way we can continue to soar to new heights is if we reach higher through our legislative program and achieve our strategic goal. As you will see in this Report, your participation has been priceless in strengthening our voice. What I know is true is that we are a purpose-driven organization full of compassionate members who are willing to help FEW get things done in monitoring and engaging in legislation for the benefit of women and federal workers. It has been a great privilege to serve during this extraordinary time and I thank you for allowing me to represent you.

[1] H.R.2119: Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act of 2021 October 26, 2021

Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act of 2021

Passed 228 - 200

(Dem: 219; Rep: 9) - (Dem: 0; Rep: 200; Ind: 0)

(PRES: 0; NV: 3)

FEW supported this Bill to provide further financial assistance for victims of domestic violence, who are overwhelmingly female, in order to mitigate the impact of domestic violence on women's safety and ability to function as parents, workers, and members of society.

FEW Position: YES

[2] H.R.1065: Pregnant Workers Fairness Act

May 14, 2021

Pregnant Workers Fairness Act

Passed 315 - 101

(Dem: 216; Rep: 99) - (Dem: 0; Rep: 101; Ind: 0)

(PRES: 0; NV: 14)

FEW supported this Bill to eliminate discrimination and promote women's health and economic security by ensuring reasonable workplace accommodations for workers whose ability to perform the functions of a job are limited by pregnancy, childbirth, or a related medical condition.

FEW Position: YES

[3] H.R.5: Equality Act

February 25, 2021

Equality Act

Passed 224 - 206

(Dem: 221; Rep: 3) - (Dem: 0; Rep: 206; Ind: 0)

(PRES: 0; NV: 2)

FEW supported this Bill to eliminate discrimination based on sex or gender identity in education, public facilities, federal funding, employment, housing, credit, and the jury system to ensure everyone has equal access to exercise their freedoms regardless of sex or gender.

FEW Position: YES

[4] H.J.Res.17: Removing the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment

March 17, 2021

Removing the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment

Passed 222 - 204

(Dem: 218; Rep: 4) - (Dem: 0; Rep: 204; Ind: 0) (PRES: 0; NV: 4)

FEW supported this Bill to eliminate the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) and finally constitute the ERA as the 28th amendment to the Constitution providing women constitutional protection against discrimination based on sex.

FEW Position: YES

[5] H.R.7: Paycheck Fairness Act

April 15, 2021

Paycheck Fairness Act

Passed 217 - 210

(Dem: 216; Rep: 1) - (Dem: 0; Rep: 210; Ind: 0)

(PRES: 0; NV: 2)

FEW supported this Bill to eliminate wage discrimination and pay disparities between men and women and to provide women further protections from violations of equal pay provisions.

FEW Position: YES

Five (5) Votes Scored - Each vote counts as 20% of the total score. A member will only receive 100% if completely aligned with FEW's position on each vote. A non-voting member (NV) receives a 0 score for each bill FEW supports.
