RETENTION

These retention percentages below represent all new degree and certificate seeking students in calendar year 2021 and how many of those students were retained one year later. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number.

GRADUATION

Graduation percentages are for all cohort students who completed the equivalent of a semester at GCU at each degree level. The undergraduate percentage uses a six-year graduation rate, the master's percentage uses a four-year graduation rate and the doctoral percentage uses an eight-year graduation rate. Bachelor's level used Cohort Year 2016 to determine the six-year graduation rate. Master's level used Cohort Year 2018 to determine the four-year graduation rate. Doctoral level used Cohort Year 2014 to determine the eight-year graduation rate.

The alumni information is calculated using the self-reported responses (excluding blank responses) from over 200 traditional students and over 2,700 online students who graduated or completed their program from Jan. 1 - Dec. 31, 2021. GCU graduates are sent the alumni survey one year after graduation. The survey prompts responses related to program and academic satisfaction, career readiness and advancement and value-add of the degree completion. Approximately 27,000 graduates were sent the survey in 2022.
