



# CP#24-04 – Code Forum & Annual Conference Site Selection

Approved: 10/12/04 | Revised: 07/11/13

- 1.0 Purpose of Council Policy:** This policy provides general criteria regarding the selection of future ICC Code Forum and the Annual Conference.
- 2.0 Site Selection:** The goal of the selection process is to provide the ICC with the best overall choice of available locations for its meetings. The ICC staff will conduct the selection process following a competitive bidding process. The process should include all cities in the region that possess the minimum requirements needed to host the Annual Conference. The Staff site award recommendations will be approved by the CEO and are subject to the provisions of CP#15 governing Signatory and Contracting Authority.
- 3.0 Regions:** The table below specifies the host site regions and the states in each region. The rotation proceeds as follows: East, South, Central, and West

Circumstances might arise that will require ICC staff and CEO to exercise greater discretion over the rotation of host sites. This is permissible in consultation with the Executive Committee of the ICC Board.

- 4.0 Committee Action Hearings:** The ICC staff and CEO will make best efforts to rotate the Committee Action Hearings amongst the various regions. Site selection will utilize a competitive bidding process for the sites included in the RFP. The nature of the Committee Action Hearings is significantly different than the Annual Conference. Therefore site selection may require a substantially different rotation schedule than contemplated above for the Annual Conference and greater level of management discretion is required.
