

Broadcast Message: DHS Announces Special Student Relief Employment Benefits to Burmese Students Experiencing Severe Economic Hardship

General Information

On May 24, 2021, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) posted a [Federal Register notice](#) announcing the suspension of certain regulatory requirements for F-1 nonimmigrant students from Burma (Myanmar) who are experiencing severe economic hardship as a result of the current crisis in Burma.

This notice temporarily suspends applicable on-campus and off-campus employment regulations for eligible Burmese students. DHS will continue to monitor the situation in Burma and will announce any additional modifications or extensions to this notice in the Federal Register.

The notice applies exclusively to F-1 nonimmigrant students who meet all of the following conditions:

- Are citizens of Burma, regardless of country of birth;
- Were lawfully present in the United States in an F-1 nonimmigrant status on May 25, 2021;
- Are enrolled in a Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP)-certified school;
- Are currently maintaining F-1 nonimmigrant status; and
- Are experiencing severe economic hardship as a direct result of the current crisis in Burma.

The suspension of these requirements will remain in effect until Nov. 25, 2022 for Burmese students.
