## Broadcast Message: DHS Redesignates and Extends Special Student Relief Employment Benefits to Haitian Students Experiencing Severe Economic Hardship

## **General Information**

On June 28, 2024, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) posted a <u>Federal Register Notice</u> announcing the suspension of certain regulatory requirements for F-1 nonimmigrant students from Haiti who are experiencing severe economic hardship as a result of the current crisis. This notice extends Special Student Relief (SSR) for eligible students from August 4, 2024until Feb. 3, 2026.

These notices temporarily suspend applicable on-campus and off-campus employment regulations for eligible Haitian students. DHS will continue to monitor the situation in Haiti and will announce any additional modifications or extensions to these notices in the Federal Register.

These notices apply exclusively to F-1 nonimmigrant students who meet all of the following conditions:

- Are citizens of Haiti regardless of country of birth (or individuals having no nationality who last habitually resided in Haiti);
- Are lawfully present in the United States in an F-1 nonimmigrant status on June 28, 2024;
- Are enrolled in a Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP)-certified school;
- Are currently maintaining F-1 nonimmigrant status; and
- Are experiencing severe economic hardship as a direct result of the current crisis.

The suspension of these requirements will remain in effect until Feb. 3, 2026, for Haitian students.
