We pulled up to the hotel, carried some bags in and I left Marilyn to register. On the way out to park the car, I met a group of people coming in.


One member of the group seemed very familiar to me. The few seconds it took for me to walk out to the car was all my mind needed to process the visual information had just gathered. Sulu!!!



the highlight of any of them was the door and I led George to HOOK. (It was




