Safety, and other documents supporting this complaint referenced herein, which are the types of reports and documents kept in the ordinary course of business, which complainant believes to be truthful and reliable because they have proven to be truthful and reliable on numerous occasions in the past.

The complainant further asserts that based upon his review of the referenced report and/or supporting documents, the incidents alleged occurred in the Village of Ashwaubenon, Brown County, Wisconsin.

1. His review of the report of Officer Mackenzie Teske of the Ashwaubenon Department of Public Safety, which indicates:

On June 21, 2020, Officer Teske was in full uniform working within the Village of Ashwaubenon, Brown County, Wisconsin. At approximately 1744 hours, he was dispatched to the area of Viking Dr. and Circle Dr. for a welfare check. Call notes stated the caller was asking for a welfare check on a female that just knocked on his door and seemed to be under the influence of narcotics.

Upon arrival, Officer Teske was heading eastbound on Circle Dr. when he located the female, later identified as Taylor D. Schabusbusiness, dob: 11/23/1997, who was now walking down the middle of the roadway on Circle Dr. The female was walking in the roadway and when Officer Teske got close to her, she pointed at him. Officer Teske turned his vehicle around and got behind her and asked her to stop. Taylor said, "Why do I have to stop for you?", and Officer Teske told her he was just making sure she was okay and knew where she was going.

Officer Teske then walked up to Taylor and asked her what was going on and she stated she was not sure and was on a different planet right now. Taylor said she had just shot up earlier in the day and showed Officer Teske her fresh track marks on her arms. Officer Teske asked her for her information, to which she told him but did it fast and he could not understand what she was saying. He asked her again and she told him, but seemed to whisper it and he could only catch a few of the letters in her name. Officer Teske noted that Taylor appeared to be under the influence of a controlled substance. BL, a fellow law enforcement officer, arrived on scene at this time and assisted Officer Teske in getting Taylor's name and date of birth.

Taylor started to get argumentative with officers and started to walk away. Officer BL stopped Taylor from walking away because she started to walk into on-coming traffic. While Officer Teske was trying to index Taylor through Brown County teletype, she continued to make strange comments that did not make sense and at one point asked, "Are you taking a shit?" Taylor continued to make absurd comments and was acting strange.

Officer BL and Officer Teske agreed that Taylor should be detained at this time for her safety because she continued to get argumentative and walk away from us. Officer BL placed her into handcuffs, double locking them for comfort. While he was doing this, Officer Teske assisted him and held onto her left arm to stabilize her until the handcuffs were on. During this time, Taylor was tensing up and attempted to pull her arm away from the officers.

As Officer Teske was waiting for the person query return from Brown County teletype, Taylor attempted to walk into traffic again and Officer BL grabbed onto her arm to stop her and escorted her back to the curb. At this time, Taylor kicked her foot back striking Officer BL in the

shin area of his leg. Officer Teske could see that it caused pain to Officer BL because he stopped walking and bent over and grimaced. Taylor attempted to kick Officer BL again but did not make contact. Officer BL was able to decentralize Taylor to the ground and when she was on the ground, she continued to resist and kick at the officers. Officer BL was able to get her on her stomach and hold her down and Officer Teske held her ankles so she could not kick the officers.

Taylor was helped to her feet and escorted to Officer Teske's squad car. At the side of his squad car, he searched her incident to arrest with negative findings of any weapons or contraband. As he was doing this, she was still resisting and fighting with officers. Taylor was placed into the back of Officer Teske's patrol vehicle and transported to Brown County Jail.

Based on the foregoing, the complainant believes this complaint to be true and correct.
