Deer Mr. Comey:

This is in response to your submission, on behalf of Harshall County, of a polling place change and precinct realignment adopted by the Harshall County Board of Supervisors and implemented by the County Board of Election Countssioners. The submission was made pursuant to Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, 42 U.S.C. 1973e.

We have examined this matter carefully and, as you may recall, advised you by our September 27 and October 27 letters of several problems noted by us in the implementation of the precinct realignment and changes in polling places. While steps were taken to remedy the misussignment of votors to some precincts, our investigation reflects that a substructial number of votors were not placed in their proper precincts for the Hovember election and that this had a racial effect. In light of the failure to properly assign these votors, I am compalied to inverpose an objection to the precinct

realignment and polling place designations for Marshell County. Please he advised, however, that this objection will be withdrawn upon a showing by the County that appropriate manuscras have been initiated to accurately locate voters and place them in their correct precimets as well as notify these voters of their precinct assignments.

Based on the available data, it appears that the failure to provide fixed boundaries for the various presincts contributed to the problem of voter misassignment and must be ramedied as part of any plan to remove the objectionable features of your manuscion. Also, the proposal to resolve the presinct boundaries must centain steps to incure that all persons who are eligible to vote for the County School Superintendent or the county board of education are able to east bailots. This would remove the problems which ensured at the Marianna, Lake Center and Red Sanks precinets during the August 3, primary.

Of course, as provided for by Section 5, you have an alternative of instituting an action in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia for declaratory judgment that the changes do not have the purpose and will not have the effect of denying or abridging the right to vote on account of race or color.
