In reviewing this submitted plan we have considered, as we have on previous occasions, relevant judicial decisions (e.g., White v. Regester, 412 U.S. 755 (1973), Whitcomb v. Chavis, 403 U.S. 124 (1971)) as well as the availability of realistic alternatives. On the basis of our analysis, however, we cannot conclude, as we must under the Voting Rights Act, that this redistricting plan does not have a racially discriminatory effect on voting. Therefore, on behalf of the Attorney General, I must interpose an objection to this plan to reapportion the Grenada County supervisor districts.

As provided in Paragraph 5 of the November 5, 1973 Supplemental Order of Judge William C. Keady, this Department will prepare and submit to the District Court a proposed plan for the redistricting of the Grenada County supervisor districts. A copy of that plan will be forwarded to you an attorney for the Board of Supervisors for your comments and objections as provided for in the Order of the Court.

Copies of this letter are being sent to Judge Keady and to attorneys for the private plaintiffs.
