


### About mini-sessions

Mini-sessions began after voters approved the flexible sessions constitutional amendment in 1973. The amendment marked the third time that voters extended the length of legislative sessions. It allows the Legislature to meet each year from January to May, for 120 legislative days over the biennium (two-year period).

However, lawmakers may continue committee work during the recess. This means committees have the same power to make recommendations on bills that they have during a legislative session.

This interim, committees have met in mini-sessions in Mankato and the Capitol in St. Paul. They will meet in Alexandria next week and Eveleth in January.


