HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1

Relating to Living Expenses During the Legislative Session.

Be It Resolved, by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, the Senate concurring, that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrants in payment of living expenses to each member of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrants in payment of living expenses to each member of the Senate, from their respective Legislative Expense Funds, for each calendar day of the 1969 Legislative Session.

Resolved Further, that per diem living expenses in the sum of \$24.00 per diem shall be paid to such members who have moved from their usual place of lodging during a substantial part of the 1969 Session of the Legislature;

Provided Further, that the per diem living expenses of members of the Legislature who have not so changed their place of lodging for a substantial part of said Session shall be the sum of \$16.00 per day.

Provided Further, each member of the Legislature shall certify in writing to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives or the Secretary of the Senate, prior to the issuance of the first of such warrants for such living expenses whether or not he has moved from his usual place of lodging.
