Head Coach Tom Thibodeau

Completing his 12th campaign as an NBA head coach and his 32nd overall NBA coaching season, he was formally named the 31st head coach in franchise history on July 30, 2020. Thibodeau led the Knickerbockers to the NBA Playoffs for the third time in his four seasons as head coach, advancing to the playoffs 22 of his 32 NBA coaching seasons. He earned 2020-21 NBA Coach of the Year honors after leading the orange and blue to their first NBA Playoff berth since 2013, recording a 41-31 (.569) record as the Knicks exhibited the unmatched defensive tenacity and all-for-one, team-oriented mindset that are trademarks of a Thibodeau-coached team.

With a 175-143 (.550) mark in four seasons with the Knicks, he is the fifth winningest coach in NYK franchise history. Thibodeau recorded his 500th career win as an NBA head coach on January 13, 2024, when the Knicks triumphed at Memphis, 106-94.

Thibodeau, 65, owns a career 527-389 (.575) regular season record, with 31-41 (.431) in Playoff competition. He has coached his teams to four 50+ win seasons and two divisional titles. Tom is the third-winningest coach in Bulls franchise history (255), trailing only Hall of Famer Phil Jackson (545) and Dick Motta (356). With 97 wins as Timberwolves coach, he is tied for second on the franchise list with Hall of Famer Rick Adelman (97), behind Flip Saunders (427).

Thibodeau's 527 career regular season wins rank 32nd on the all-time NBA list. Tom's .575 career winning percentage ranks 21st all-time among NBA coaches who have logged at least 500 games. He completed the 2023-24 season ranked fifth among active head coaches in wins (527).

A two-time honoree as NBA Coach of the Year (2010-11 with Chicago, 2020-21 with New York), Tom is also a seven-time NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month (most recently in May 2021 with the Knicks). Thibodeau has coached in three NBA Finals (1999 with the Knicks, 2008 and 2010 with Boston), earning an NBA Championship ring with the 2008 Boston Celtics. He was voted NBA Coach of the Year in 2010-11 after leading the Chicago Bulls to a 62-win season. Tom's teams have advanced to the Playoffs in 20 (of his 30) NBA coaching seasons.

In 2020-21, Thibodeau joined Hall of Famers Red Holzman (1969-70) and Pat Riley (1992-93) as the only Knicks mentors to win the League's Coach of the Year award. Ending a seven-year post-season dry spell, the Knicks recorded their winningest season (41-31) since they won the Atlantic Division title in 2012-13 (54-28). New York led the NBA in fewest points allowed (104.7), lowest opposing field goal pct. (.440) and lowest opposition 3PT pct. (.337). According to Elias, the 2020-21 Knicks joined their fabled 60-win team of 1992-93 as the only teams in NBA history to lead the League in opposing ppg, FG pct. and 3PT pct. (Boston joined that elite group a year later, in 2021-22).

Re-joining the Knicks in Summer 2020, Thibodeau returned to the scene of some of his earliest coaching triumphs. Tom's initial stint in New York spanned seven seasons (1996-97 through 2002-03) as an assistant coach under Jeff Van Gundy and Don Chaney. The Knicks advanced to the NBA Playoffs in each of his first five seasons in New York, including trips to the East Finals in 1999 and 2000 and an Eastern Conference Championship in 1999.

2023-24 PLAYOFF KNICKS NOTES

SERIES TIED AT 3-3 The Knicks were defeated by the Pacers in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals, 116-103 at Gainbridge Fieldhouse. Precious Achiuwa came off the bench and recorded 12 points, eight rebounds, two steals, and two blocks. Achiuwa joins Anthony Mason (1993) and Marcus Camby (1999) as the only players in franchise history to come off the bench and record at least 10 points, eight rebounds, two steals, and two blocks in a playoff game. Miles McBride registered 20 points on 66.7 percent shooting, four made three-pointers, two rebounds, one assist, and one steal. McBride becomes the third Knick to record at least 20 points on 65+ percent shooting and four made three-pointers in a playoff game, joining John Starks (1994) and Derek Harper (1995).

KNICKS BOUNCE BACK IN GAME 5: The Knicks defeated the Pacers in Game 5 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals, 121-91 at Madison Square Garden. Jalen Brunson registered 44 points and seven assists, marking his fifth game this postseason recording at least 40 points and five assists. He joins Michael Jordan, Jerry West, and Lebron James as the only players with five or more games of 40+ points and five or more assists in a single postseason in NBA history. Brunson also recorded his fifth 40+ point game of the postseason, which is the second most 40+ point games in a single postseason in Knicks playoff history, trailing Benard King (6). In addition, Brunson scored 28 points on 66.7 shooting, four assists, and two rebounds in the first half. Brunson surpasses Carmelo Anthony for most points scored in a half by a Knick since 1997.

Alec Burks came off the bench and scored 20 points and five made three-pointers. Burks becomes the third player in franchise history to come off the bench and record five made three-pointers in a playoff game, joining Miles McBride and Hubert Davis.

The Knicks defeated the Pacers by 30 points, forced 18 turnovers, and outrebounded Indiana on the offensive glass by 15, becoming the first team in NBA playoff history to accomplish this feat. The Knicks also scored 69 points in the first half tonight, marking the first time the Knicks have recorded at least 69 points in a first half since 1970. The Pacers were held to 91 points, marking the second time this postseason the Knicks held their opponent 100 points or less.

SERIES TIED AT 2-2: The Knicks were defeated by the Pacers in Game 4 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals, 121-89 at Gainbridge Fieldhouse. Alec Burks came off the bench and recorded 20 points, two made three-pointers, five rebounds, and two assists. Burks joins John Starks (1998) as the only players in franchise history to come off the bench and record at least 20 points, five rebounds, and two made three-pointers in a playoff game. Miles McBride came off the bench and registered 16 points, three made three-pointers, five rebounds, and four assists. McBride becomes the third Knick to come off the bench and record at least 15 points, three made three-pointers, and five rebounds in a playoff game, joining Glen Rice and John Starks.

<u>DONTE'S INFERNO:</u> The Knicks were defeated by the Pacers in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals, 116-111 at Gainbridge Fieldhouse. Donte DiVincenzo recorded a playoff- career high 35 points, seven made three-pointers, three rebounds, two assists, one steal, and one block. DiVincenzo became the first Knick in franchise history, to record at least 35 points and seven made three-pointers in a playoff game. DiVincenzo also tallied seven made-three pointers, which ties John Starks and Derek Harper for the most made three-pointers in a playoff game in franchise history. In addition, DiVincenzo recorded his fourth consectuive playoff game with at least five made three-pointers. He now joins Klay Thompson, Stephen Curry, and Donovan Mitchell as the only players in playoff history to record at least five made-three pointers in four or more consecutive games.

Josh Hart tallied a playoff career-high 18 rebounds, 10 points, four asissts, and two steals. Hart becomes the first Knick since Patrick Ewing (1999) to record at least 15 rebounds in back-to-back playoff games. Hart also becomes the fourth Knick to recorded at least 18 rebounds, 10 points, and two steals in a playoff game, joining Mitchell Robinson, Patrick Ewing, and Charles Oakley. Jalen Brunson recorded 26 points, six assists, and one steal, marking Brunson's 14th playoff game as a Knick recording at least 25 points. He now breaks a tie with Carmelo Anthony for fourth most such playoff games in franchise history.

The Knicks shot 51.9 percent from beyond the arc, marking the first time they have shot over 50 percent from three in a playoff game since 2000.

KNICKS DEFEND HOMECOURT: The Knicks defeated the Pacers in Game 2 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals, 130-121 at Madison Square Garden. Jalen Brunson scored a team-high 29 points in 32 minutes of play. He became the fourth Knick to score 29+ points playing 33 minutes or less in a playoff game in team history and the first since Latrell Sprewell in 1999. OG Anunoby and Donte DiVincenzo added 28 points each, marking the first time three players each scored 28+ points in a playoff game in team history. They are also the first trio in the NBA to accomplish the feat since Willie Anderson, David Robinson, and Rod Strickland did so for the Spurs in 1991. Anunoby also recorded 22 points on 53.3 percent shooting, four rebounds, two assists and three made three-pointers in the first half. This marked Anunoby's first 20-point half in his playoff career. His 28 points are also a playoff career high.

The Knicks scored 130 points tonight, marking the fifth time scoring 130+points in a playoff game in team history and the first since 1990. All five Knicks starters recorded double figure scoring for the fourth time this postseason, which ranks first in the NBA. The Knicks shot 57% from the field, 46.7% from three, and 81.8% from the free throw line, marking the first time the Knicks shot at least 57% from the field, 46% from three, and 81% from the line in a playoff game since 1990.

JALEN DROPS 40+ IN FOUR STRAIGHT: The Knicks defeated the Pacers in Game 1 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals, 121-117 at Madison Square Garden. Jalen Brunson recorded 43 points, six assists, six rebounds, and one block. Brunson becomes the first player in NBA history to record at least 40 points, and five assists in four consecutive playoff games. He also became the fourth player in history with four straight 40-point games in the postseason, joining Jerry West (who had six consecutive 40-point games), Bernard King (4), and Michael Jordan (4). Brunson also recorded at least 30 points and five assists in five consecutive playoff games. He is also the fifth player in NBA history to accomplish this, joining Oscar Robertson, Michael Jordan, Kobe Bryant, and LeBron James. Brunson also registered his fifth game this postseason with 25+ points and five or more assists. He passed Walt Frazier for the most such games in a single postseason in Knicks history.

Josh Hart scored 24 points on 69.2 percent shooting, 13 rebounds, eight assists, two steals, and one block. Hart becomes the first player in franchise history to record at least 20 points on 65 percent shooting, 12 rebounds, and eight assists in a playoff game. Donte DiVincenzo registered 25 points, five made three-pointers on 55.6 percent from beyond the arc, and two blocks. DiVincenzo joins Larry Johnson as the only Knick to record at least 25 points, five made three-pointers on 50 percent or better from three without making a free throw in team playoff history.



All five Knicks starters recorded double figure scoring and at least one three-pointer for the first time in team playoff history. The Knicks shot 47.8 percent from three tonight, marking the first time the Knicks shot at least 47 percent from three in a playoff game since 2000.

KNICKS ADVANCE TO ECSF: The Knicks defeated the 76ers in Game 6 118-115 at Wells Fargo Center, winning the series 4-2 and advancing to the Eastern Conference Semifinals. Jalen Brunson recorded 41 points, 12 assists, and three rebounds. Brunson is now the seventh player in NBA history, and just the second Knick (Bernard King - 1984) to record 40-points in three consecutive playoff games. Brunson also joined Bernard King as the only players to record at least 35 points in four consecutive playoff games in franchise history. In addition, Brunson is the first player since Stephen Curry (2019) to accomplish this feat in playoff history.

Josh Hart registered 16 points, 14 rebounds, and seven assists. This marks Hart's third playoff game as a knick recording at least 15 points, 10 rebounds, and three made three-pointers. Hart is now tied with Julius Randle for most such games in franchise history. OG Anunoby amassed 19 points, nine rebounds, two steals, and two blocks. Anunoby becomes the fifth Knick to record at least 19 points, nine rebounds, two steals, and two blocks in a playoff game joining Josh Hart, Marcus Camby, Patrick Ewing, and Bob McAdoo. Donte DiVincenzo recorded 23 points, five made three-pointers, seven assists, three blocks, and two steals. DiVincenzo becomes the first Knick to record at least 20 points, three made three-pointers, and seven assists in a playoff game since John Starks (1996). DiVincenzo also become first guard in franchise history to record three blocks and two steals in a playoff game.

BRUNSON DROPS 40 IN OT LOSS: The Knicks were defeated by the 76ers in Game 5 112-106 at Madison Square Garden. Jalen Brunson recorded 40 points, six assists, three rebounds, and three steals. Brunson joined Bernard King as the only Knicks to record at least 40 points in back-to-back playoff games. Brunson also recorded his third consecutive game with at least 30 points, and joined Bernard King as the only Knicks to record multiple streaks of three or more consecutive 30-point games in the postseason. Josh Hart registered 18 points, nine rebounds, four assists, and one block. Hart becomes the first Knick to record at least 15 points, nine rebounds, four assists, and one block in a playoff game since Carmelo Anthony (2011). Mitchell Robinson came off the bench and registered seven rebounds, three steals, and two blocks. Robinson becomes the first Knick to come off the bench and record at least seven rebounds, three steals, and two blocks in playoff game since Marcus Camby (1999).

The Knicks held the 76ers to 37 percent from the field in the first half. This marks the third time this series the Knicks have held the 76ers to 37 percent or less from the field in a half. The Knicks also recorded 10 steals and eight blocks, marking the first time the Knicks recorded at least 10 steals and eight blocks in a playoff game since 2013.

KNICKS TAKE 3-1 LEAD: The Knicks defeated the 76ers in Game 4 97-92 at Wells Fargo Center. Jalen Brunson recorded 47 points, 10 assists, four rebounds, and one block. Brunson has set a franchise record for the most points in a playoff game surpassing Bernard King (46 Points – 1984). Brunson is also the first Knick in franchise history to record at least 30 points and 10 assists in back-to-back playoff games. In addition, Brunson registered 24 points in the second half, marking the seventh time Brunson has record at least 20 points in a half in a playoff game. He is now ranked first in franchise history for most such halves in playoff history surpassing Carmelo Anthony.

Josh Hart tallied a game-high 17 rebounds, five assists, four points, and three blocks. Hart now joins Patrick Ewing as the only players in franchise history to record at least 15 rebounds, five assists, and three blocks in a playoff game. OG Anunoby registered 16 points, 14 rebounds, and three blocks. He the first player in franchise history to record at least 15 points, 10 rebounds, and three blocks in a playoff game since Patrick Ewing (2000). Anunoby is also the fourth Knick to accomplish this feat joining Patrick Ewing, Marcus Camby, and Bill Cartwright. Precious Achiuwa came off the bench and recorded seven rebounds, four blocks, and two assists. Achiuwa is now the fourth player in franchise history to come off the bench and record at least seven rebounds, and four blocks in a playoff game joining Mitchell Robinson, Kenyon Martin, and Marcus Camby.

The Knicks recorded 11 blocks, marking the first time the Knicks recorded at least 10 blocks in a playoff game since 2000.

GAME 3 IN PHILLY: The New York Knicks were defeated by the Philadelphia 76ers in Game 3 125-114 at Wells Fargo Center. Jalen Brunson recorded 39 points, 13 assists, and two rebounds. Brunson joins Walt Frazier as the only players in franchise history to record at least 35 points and 10 assists in a playoff game. Brunson also registered his second playoff game as a Knick, recording at least 30 points and 10 assists. He is now tied with Walt Frazier for most such games in franchise history. Josh Hart registered 20 points, four made three-pointers, six rebounds, and six assists. Hart is the first player in franchise history to record at least four three-pointers in three consecutive playoff games. OG Anunoby amassed 17 points on 63.6 percent shooting, three made three-pointers on 75 percent from beyond the arc, four rebounds, and two assists. Anunoby becomes the first Knick to record at least 15 points on 60 percent shooting and 75 percent from beyond the arc in a playoff game since Iman Shumpert (2013).

KNICKS GO UP 2-0: The New York Knicks defeated the Philadelphia 76ers in Game 2 104-101 at Madison Square Garden. Josh Hart recorded 21 points, 15 rebounds, two steals, and two blocks. Hart is the first Knick to record at least 20 points and 15 rebounds in a playoff game since Carmelo Anthony (2011). Hart also becomes the first Knick to register at least 20 points, two steals and two blocks in a playoff game since Marcus Camby (1999). Jalen Brunson recorded 24 points, eight rebounds, and six assists. This marks Brunson's second consecutive game recording at least 20 points, five rebounds, and five assists. He now becomes the fifth Knick to achieve this feat in playoff history joining Patrick Ewing, Walt Frazier, Jerry Lucas, and Willis Reed. Isaiah Hartenstein tallied 14 points on 87.5 percent shooting, and three blocks. Hartenstein is the first Knick to record at least 10 points on 85 percent shooting and three blocks in a playoff game since Marvin Webster (1984).

All Knicks starters recorded double-figure scoring. This marks the first time the Knicks have achieved this feat in a playoff game since 2000.

PROTECT HOME COURT: The New York Knicks defeated the

Philadelphia 76ers in Game 1 111-104 at Madison Square Garden. Josh Hart recorded 22 points, four made three-pointers, 13 rebounds, and two assists. Hart joins Carmelo Anthony (2011) as the only players in franchise history to record at least 20 points, 10 rebounds, and four made three-pointers in a playoff game. Miles McBride recorded 21 points and five made three-pointers on 71.3 percent shooting from behind the arc. McBride became the first player in franchise history to register at least 20 points, five made three-pointers on 70 percent three-point shooting in a playoff game since Larry Johnson (2000).

The Knicks tallied 55 rebounds, marking the first time the Knicks have recorded at least 55 rebounds in a playoff game since 1984. The Knicks also held the 76ers to 12 points in the 2nd quarter tonight. This marks the first time the Knicks have held their opponent to 12 points or less in a quarter in a playoff game, since 2013 (Eastern Quarter Finals against Boston).

2023–24 KNICKS KNOTES

14-2 IN JANUARY: After defeating the Utah Jazz (Jan. 30), the Knicks won 14 games in the month of January, including an eight-game win streak. This marks the first time the Knicks have won at least 14 games in a month since March 1994. The 14 wins this month are also tied for the second-most wins in a month in franchise history.

Tom Thibodeau was also announced as the Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for leading the Knicks to a 14-2 record in January. This marks the eighth time he has earned Coach of the Month, which ranks fourth among current NBA coaches. (Popovich 17, Rivers 14, Spoelstra 9).

KNICKS CLINCHED PLAYOFF BERTH:

The Knicks have clinched a playoff berth for the third time since Tom Thibodeau became the head coach ahead of the 2020-21 season.

The Knicks have now registered three consecutive road wins (@MIL Apr. 7, @CHI Apr. 9, and @BOS Apr. 11). In addition, all five starters scored in double figures for the 10th time this season.

Jalen Brunson recorded 39 points on 65.2 percent shooting, four assists, and two rebounds against the Celtics (Apr. 11). This marked Brunson fifth consecutive game recording at least 35 points. He joined Bernard King (1984-85) and Carmelo Anthony (2013-14) as the only Knicks to record 35+ points in five consecutive games. Brunson is the first Knick to record at least 35 points, 10 assists, two made three-pointers, and three steals since Raymond Felton (2010). Brunson has registered 30+ points and 10+ assists in the same game for the in fourth time season, which ranks fourth most such games in franchise history.

Josh Hart recorded 31 points on 73.6 percent shooting, nine rebounds, and eight assists against the Kings (Apr. 4). Hart is the first Knick to record at least 30 points on 70 percent shooting, eight rebounds, and eight assists in a game since Walt Bellamy (1966).

Jalen Brunson scored a career-high 61 points on 53.1 percent shooting against San Antonio (Mar. 29). His 61 points rank second all-time in Knicks history, trailing only Carmelo Anthony (62 points). Brunson's 61 points also are the sixth most points scored in a game by any player this season, trailing Luka Doncic (73), Joel Embiid (71), Giannis Antetokounmpo (64), Devin Booker (62), and Karl Anthony Towns (62).

He also registered a career-high 38 points in the second half, which surpassed Carmelo Anthony (37 points) for the most points scored in a half in Knicks history since the 1997-98 season.

Jalen Brunson recorded his second 50-point game of the season. He is the fourth Knick to record multiple 50-point games in the same season joining Bernard King, Richie Guerin, and Allan Houston. He's also the first Knick since the 2002-03 to record at least two 50-point games in the same season. Brunson is the sixth player to record multiple 50-point games this season.

Donte DiVincenzo recorded a career-high 40 points, 11 made three-pointers, five rebounds, and two assists against Detroit (Mar. 25). His 11 made three-pointers set a franchise record, surpassing Evan Fournier and JR Smith who previously held the record with 10 made three-pointers in a single game. He also joined Stephen Curry and Keegan Murray as the only players in the NBA this season to record at least 11 made three-pointers in a game.

KNICKS SWEEP SEASON SERIES AGAINST THE RAPTORS:

The Knicks recorded season highs by registering 45 points in the first quarter, 80 points in the first half, and a 145 total points against the Raptors (Mar. 27). This marks the first time the Knicks have recorded 145 points in a game, since the 2005-06 season (151-145 win vs. Detroit 30T), and the first time the Knicks recorded 145 points in a complete regulation game since the 1980-81 season (149-118 win vs. Detroit). The Knicks also recorded their largest margin of victory against the Raptors, defeating them by 44 points. The Knicks never trailed against the Raptors (Mar. 27), marking the Knicks' 13th wire-to-wire victory this season, which leads the NBA.

Miles McBride recorded a career-high nine made three-pointers on 64.2 percent shooting from downtown, against Toronto (Mar. 27). He also tied his career-high with 29 points, seven assists, three steals, and one steal. McBride has now registered at least six made three-pointers in three games this season. McBride started in his last five games and has averaged 21.6 points, 3.8 assists, 1.1 steals, while shooting 55 percent from the field, 49 percent from downtown, and 92 percent from the stripe.

KNICKS DEFEAT THE NETS FOR THE FIFTH STRAIGHT GAME:

Donte DiVincenzo recorded a game-high 31 points, four made three-pointers, two steals, and one block against the Nets (Mar. 23). This marks DiVincenzo's fourth game this season recording at least 30 points, four made three-pointers, two steals, and one block, which ranks third for most such games in the NBA this season.

Miles McBride registered 26 points on 56.2% shooting from the field, 50% from beyond the arc, and 100% from the free throw line against the Nets (Mar. 23). This marks the first time in his career with 25 points on 55-50-100 shooting splits. McBride also tied his career-high on three-pointers made with six.

Josh Hart tallied a game-high 13 rebounds, along with six points, and five assists against the Nets (Mar. 23). Hart now has recorded 10+ rebounds in 29 games this season, which is the most games with 10+ rebounds by a player 6'4" or shorter in franchise history.

KNICKS WRAP UP WEST COAST TRIP:

Jalen Brunson recorded a team-high 26 points, nine assists, and two made three-pointers at Denver (Mar. 21). Over his last four games, he is averaging 36.8 points per game, which leads the league. He also has accumulated 171 made three-pointers this season, which ranks 10th all time in Knicks history.

Isaiah Hartenstein recorded a career-high 20 points on 80 percent shooting, eight rebounds, two blocks, and one steal at Denver (Mar. 21). This marks his third game of the season, recording 15+ points on 80

percent shooting, at least six rebounds, at least two blocks and at least one steal.

KNICKS WIN FOUR STRAIGHT:

Jalen Brunson followed up his Eastern Conference Player of the Week Award, by recording 34 points, seven assists, five rebounds and one steal against the Warriors (Mar. 18). He is now the fifth NBA player this season to total 120+ points over a three-game span, joining Joel Embiid, Luka Doncic, Devin Booker, and Giannis Antetokounmpo. Brunson has also averaged 40.3 points per game over the last three games, which leads the

Miles McBride started his sixth game of the season and recorded a career-high 29 points on 69.2 percent shooting, while recording six made three-pointers at Golden State (Mar. 18). He also recorded 19 of his 29 points, in the first half, while shooting 71.4 percent from downtown.

BRUNSON JOINS KNICKS HISTORY:

Jalen Brunson registered 42 points on 60.7 percent shooting against the Kings (Mar. 16). He has now recorded 40+ points in consecutive games, marking the first time a Knick has recorded 40+ points in back-to-back games since Carmelo Anthony (2014). Brunson is also the fourth Knick in franchise history to record 40+ points in consecutive games, joining Bernard King, Patrick Ewing, and Carmelo Anthony.

In addition, Brunson registered his eighth 40+ point game of the season, which ties Giannis Antetokounmpo and De'Aaron Fox for the fourth-most 40 point+ games in the NBA this season. Brunson also registered his 12th 40+ point game as a Knick, which ranks fifth all time in franchise history.

JALEN DROPS 45 POINTS IN RIP CITY:

Jalen Brunson registered 45 points against the Trail Blazers (Mar. 14), marking his sixth 40+ point game of the season. He is also tied with Stephen Curry for the fifth-most 40 point+ games in the NBA this season. Brunson also registered his 10th 40+ point game as a Knick, which ties Julius Randle for the fifth most such in franchise history.

KNICKS GET A BIG WIN AHEAD OF 4-GAME WEST COAST TRIP:

The Knicks held the 76ers to 79 points (Mar. 12), marking the first time the team have held their opponent under 80 points in three consecutive games since the 2000-01 season. The Knicks also held Philadelphia to 37.5% from the field, 24.2% from three, and out rebounded the team by 20. This marks the fourth time in franchise history and the first time since 1993-94 that the Knicks have held their opponent to under 80 points, under 40% from the field, under 25% from three, and out rebounded their opponent by 20 or more. In addition, the Knicks allowed 14 points in the first quarter, the fewest points allowed in the first quarter this season.

Josh Hart recorded 20 points, 19 rebounds, and 10 assists, his fourth triple-double this season. He is the sixth player in franchise history to record four or more triple-doubles in a single season. He also joins Richie Guerin and David Lee as the only players in Knicks history with 20+ points, 19+ rebounds, and 10+ assists in a game.

KNICKS' DEFENSE ALLOWED 79 POINTS IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES:

The Knicks held the 76ers to 79 points (Mar. 10), marking the second consecutive game the Knicks have held their opponent below 79 points (98-74 vs. Orlando, Mar. 8). This also marks the first time the Knicks have held their opponent below 79 points in back-to-back games since 2004.



The Knicks are also the first NBA team to achieve this feat since the Memphis Grizzlies (2005).

PRECIOUS ANCHORS THE KNICKS' DEFENSE:

Precious Achiuwa recorded 15 points, 14 rebounds, four assists, two steals, and a career-high five blocks vs Orlando (Mar. 8). This marks his eighth double-double on the season, and his fifth time recording at least three blocks this season. Achiuwa is also the sixth player this season, to record 15+ points, 14+ rebounds, two+ steals, and five+ blocks in a game, joining Anthony Davis, Joel Embiid, Giannis Antetokounmpo, Victor Wembanyama, and Daniel Gafford.

Achiuwa is also the third Knick in team history, and the first Knick since 1996, to record 15+ points, 14+ rebounds, at least four assists, at least five blocks, and at least two steals. He joins Patrick Ewing (last: 1996) and Bob McAdoo (1978) as the only Knicks to record this stat line.

The Knicks held the Magic to 74 points against the Magic. This marks the first time the Knicks have held an opponent to 74 points since Apr. 13, 2012 (Wizards). The Knicks also held the Magic to 34.2 percent shooting from the field. This marks the first time the Knicks have held an opponent below 35 percent shooting since Dec. 4, 2022 (Cleveland).

MESSED AROUND AND GOT A TRIPLE DOUBLE:

Josh Hart recorded his third career triple-double, registering 13 points, 19 rebounds, 10 assists, two steals, two blocks and three made three-pointers vs. Cleveland (Mar. 3). Josh Hart is now one of five players to record a triple-double with 19+ rebounds this season, joining LeBron James, Nikola Jokic, Domantas Sabonis, and Bam Adebayo. Hart also joined Richie Guerin (1957) and David Lee (2010), as the only Knicks to record a triple double with at least 19 rebounds.

DONTE MOVES UP KNICKS' 3PM HISTORY:

Donte DiVincenzo recorded a game-high 28 points, six rebounds, four assists, three steals, one block, and six made three-pointers vs. Cleveland (Mar. 3). He has now accumulated 209 made three pointers this season, which ranks fourth in Knicks history. He is also the 23rd player in NBA history and first Knick to have 185+ three-point field goals through the team's first 60 games of a season.

REBOUNDING WITH HIS HART:

Josh Hart recorded 14 points, 18 rebounds, seven assists, and three threepoint field goals vs. Golden State (Feb. 29). Over his last five games, he has averaged 17.2 points per game, 11.2 rebounds per game, 5.4 assists per game, and 2.2 three-point field goals per game, joining Julius Randle as the only Knicks to average 15+ points per game, 10+ rebounds per game, five or more assists per game, and two or more three-point field goals per game over a five-game span.

BRUNSON ECLIPSES 1,550 POINTS IN FIRST 60 GAMES:

Jalen Brunson recorded a team-high 27 points, while shooting 57.1 percent from downtown, five rebounds, and five assists vs. Golden State (Feb. 29). He has now scored 1,551 points this season, which makes him the fifth Knick in team history to score 1,550+ points in the team's first 60 games. He joins Patrick Ewing (twice), Richie Guerin, Carmelo Anthony, and Bernard King.

JALEN RECORDS HIS 24th 30 POINT GAME OF THE SEASON:

Jalen Brunson registered 35 points and 12 assists against the Pistons (Feb. 26), marking his third career game recording at least 30 points and at least 10 assists as a Knick. He is now tied with Julius Randle for fifth most such games in franchise history. He has also recorded his 27th 30-point games of the season, which is tied for sixth in the NBA this season. Brunson also the only player in the NBA this season, to eclipse

1,500 points, 150 made three pointers, while shooting at least 40-percent from the three-point line, and 47-percent from the field.

COACH MOVING UP THE RANKS:

Tom Thibodeau earned his 500th win as a head coach against the Memphis Grizzlies (Jan. 13). He became the 36th head coach in NBA history to earn at least 500 wins. KNICKS GET BACK ON TRACK:

The Knicks snapped a four-game losing streak by defeating the 76ers 110-96. The Knicks had three players record double-doubles in the same game for the first time since December 2022. Jalen Brunson recorded 21 points and 12 assists (fourth double-double of the season), Josh Hart recorded 18 points and 12 rebounds (10th double-double of the season), and Precious Achiuwa recorded 18 points and 11 boards (seventh doubledouble of the season). Bojan Bogdanovic also eclipsed 20 points and three steals off the bench, shooting a perfect six-for-six from downtown. This marks his first 20+ point game since joining the Knicks at the trade deadline.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR:

Jalen Brunson became the fourth Knicks' point guard since the 1975-76 season, to be selected to the NBA All Star Game. He joins Walt Frazier (1975-76), Michael Ray Richardson (1980-82, and Mark Jackson (1988-89). Brunson also helped the Eastern Conference All Stars, by tallying 12 points, five assists, four rebounds, and one steal in his All-Star Game debut (Feb. 18).

BRUNSON'S FIRST 50 GAMES:

This season, Jalen Brunson has totaled 1,374 points, 132 made threepointers, while shooting 40.7% from the three-point line through the first 50 games. He is now the first Knick since Carmelo Anthony (2012-13), to eclipse 1,300+ points and 125+ made three pointers through the first 50 games of a season.

Jalen Brunson scored a game-high 39 points against the Pacers (Feb. 10) and has now scored 3,007 points as Knick in 118 games played. He is now tied with Carmelo Anthony for the second fewest games to score 3,000 points in team history, trailing only Bob McAdoo (113 games). Brunson also has the sixth most 30-point games in the NBA this season (21). Brunson's 21 30-point games is also tied with Dick Barnett, for the most 30-point games through the first 50 games of a season in Knicks history.

After completing a six-player trade, the shorthanded Knicks fell to the Dallas Mavericks while only have eight eligible players available. Donte DiVincenzo led the Knicks for the second consecutive game, scoring a game-high 36 points, three assists, two rebounds, and seven made threepointers against the Mavericks (Feb. 8). This marks his fifth game this season with seven or more made three-pointers, and he is now tied with Terry Rozier for the third most such games in the NBA this season. Heading into this game, DiVincenzo recorded 150 made three-pointers, which tied his career-high set from last season in 21 fewer games and 18

Josh Hart recorded 23 points, 10 rebounds, and 12 assists, his second triple double of the season. He joins Julius Randle and Immanuel Quickley as the only Knicks to record multiple triple doubles in a single season since 1990. He is also the ninth player in the NBA to record multiple triple doubles this season.

KNICKS GET BACK ON TRACK:

Donte DiVincenzo led the Knicks, scoring a game-high 32 points, adding to his five rebounds, five assists, and three steals, his first career game with 30+ points, five or more rebounds, five or more assists, and three or more steals in a home win against the Grizzlies (Feb. 6).

In addition, this is also his fourth game registering 20+ points, three+ steals, while shooting at least 60% from the field. DiVincenzo is one of six NBA players, to register at least 20 points on 60 % shooting, and three+ steals in at least four games this season.

Jalen Brunson scored 27 points, including 15 in the first quarter, his 23rd game as a Knick with 15+ points in a quarter. He has now broken a tie with Latrell Sprewell for the fourth most such games by a Knick since 1996-97.

The Knicks scored 123 points against the Grizzlies including a 70-46 halftime lead. It is the first time this season that the team scored 70+ points and led by more than 20 points at halftime. The 24-point lead is also this largest at halftime this season. The Knicks also forced 19 turnovers, including 13 steals and five blocks. This is the first time the team has forced 19+ turnovers, 13+ steals, and five or more blocks since 2021.

BRUNSON NAMED AN ALL-STAR AND DROPS 40:

Jalen Brunson and Julius Randle were named NBA All-Stars (Feb 1), which marks the first time the Knicks have had two players named to the NBA All-Star game since the 2012-13 season (Carmelo Anthony & Tyson Chandler).

Jalen Brunson registered 40 points, his fifth game this season with 40+ points. He is now tied with Patrick Ewing and Carmelo Anthony for the second most 40-point games through the team's first 50 games of a season. He is also tied for the fourth most 40-point games in the NBA this season. Brunson also registered 21 points in the first half, which marks the 13th time he has recorded at least 20 points in a half this season. He is now tied for third most such games through a team's first 50 games of a season in franchise history. Brunson is the only player in the NBA this season, to record at least 1300 total points, 125 made three pointers, while shooting at least 40% from the three-point line.

The Knicks also came back from a 15-point deficit against the Pacers (Feb.1). This marks their ninth consecutive win, which ties for the longest winning streak in the NBA this season. It was also the team's fifth consecutive game with 10 or less turnovers, tied for the longest streak in franchise history. The Knicks recorded 24 offensive rebounds. This is the first time the Knicks recorded at least 24 offensive rebounds since 2019.

DONTE RECORDS A CAREER-HIGH NINE 3PTERS:

Donte DiVincenzo recorded 33 points against Utah (Jan. 30), including 19 in the first half, the most points he's had in the first half in his career. He also added a career high nine made three-point field goals and four steals. He is the second Knick to record 30+ points, nine or more made threepointers, and four or more steals, joining Jalen Brunson. He is also the 10th player in NBA history to achieve the feat.

Josh Hart also added 10 points, 10 assists, and 10 rebounds, his first career triple-double again the Jazz (Jan. 30).

All five Knicks starters each scored 10+ points again Utah (Jan. 30) for the fourth time this season. The team is 3-1 when achieving this feat. The Knicks recorded 29 assists and five turnovers, marking the second time in franchise history that the team posted 29 or more assists and five or fewer turnovers.

KNICKS WIN BY A SEASON-HIGH 38 POINTS:

- The Knicks defeated the Nuggets by a margin of 38 points. This marks the team's largest winning margin this season.
- By defeating the Nuggets 122-84, this marks the fifth time the Knicks have scored more than 120 points and held their opponent to under 100 points this season. They are now tied for second most such games in the NBA this season.
- The Knicks held the Nuggets to 19.2 percent from the three-point line. This marks the second time the Knicks have held their opponent under 20 percent from the three-point line this season. They are now tied for second most such games in the NBA this
- The Knicks held the Nuggets to 41 points in the first half, which ties for the lowest the Knicks have held an opponent in the first half this season.

OG SWIPES A SEASON-HIGH SIX STEALS: OG Anunoby registered 26 points, six steals, and three made three-pointers in a home win against the Denver Nuggets.



Anunoby joins Nikola Jokic, Anthony Davis, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, Jaren Jackson Jr., and De'Aaron Fox, as the only players this season to record 25+ points and at least six steals in a game. Anunoby is the first player in the NBA this season, to register 25+ points, at least six steals, and at least three made three-pointers. Anunoby also is first Knick to achieve this feat since Johnny Newman (1988).

JALEN AND JULIUS SCORE 30+: Julius Randle scored 30 points on 52.6 percent shooting and a perfect 8-8 from the stripe, while Jalen Brunson scored 30 points, while shooting 50 percent from the field in road win against Brooklyn. This is now their fifth time recording 30+ points in the same game this season, and eighth time overall, which ranks second-most by a Knicks duo in team history.

Brunson and Randle surpassed Patrick Ewing and Gerald Wilkins for second-most games where teammates both score 30+ points in a season.

JALEN AND JULIUS LEAD THE KNICKS IN A HOME WIN:

Julius Randle recorded 18 points, 16 rebounds, and 10 assists in a home win against Toronto (Jan. 20). This marks his 14th career triple double and his eighth as a Knick. It also marks Randle's second game as a Knick registering at least 15 points, 15 rebounds, and 10 assists. He is now tied with Walt Frazier for the second most such games in franchise history.

Jalen Brunson registered 38 points, nine assists, and five rebounds against the Raptors. Brunson joins Julius Randle, Carmelo Anthony, and Walt Frazier as the only players to record at least 35 points, five rebounds, and five assists in back-to-back games in franchise history.

JALEN'S FIRST 40 GAMES: Jalen Brunson scored 41 points and tallied eight rebounds, and eight assists in a home win against the Wizards (Jan. 18). This marks his eighth game as a Knick with at least 40 points, ranking him seventh most in franchise history. Brunson also joins Giannis Antetokounmpo, and Luka Doncic as the only players to record at least 40 points, eight rebounds, and eight assists in a game this season.

Through the first 40 games of the season, Jalen Brunson has totaled 1,050 points, 100 made three-pointers on 42.6% shooting. He joins Carmelo Anthony (2012-13), as the only Knicks to eclipse 1000+ points, 100+ made three-pointers on at least 40% shooting from the three-point line through the first 40 games of a season. THE KNICKS RETURN TO THE WIN COLUMN VS. HOUSTON:

- This marked the 12th game this season in which the Knicks allowed under 100 points, which ties the Timberwolves for the most such games in the NBA this year.
- Julius Randle scored a game-high 31 points and grabbed eight rebounds, his 66th game as a Knick with 30+ points and five or more rebounds. He is now tied with Willis Reed for the third most such games in team history.
- Jalen Brunson added 30 points, his 30th game as a Knick with 30+ points. He achieved the feat in his 107th game with the team, the third fewest games in Knicks history.
- Josh Hart tallied 10 points and 13 rebounds off the bench, marking the fourth time Hart has recorded a double-double off the bench as a Knick. He now has the most double-doubles by a Knicks guard off the bench in team history, passing Damyean Dotson and Immanuel Quickley.

JULIUS' FIRST 40 GAMES: Through the first 40 games of the season, Julius Randle has totaled 966 points, 366 rebounds, and 192 assists. He is the only player in Knicks history to amass 950+ points, 350+ rebounds, and 150+ assists through the first 40 games of a season, which marks the second time he's achieved this feat in his Knicks career (975 points, 400 rebounds, 152 assists - 2022-23). JULIUS SCHOOLING HIS OPPONENTS ON AND OFF THE COURT:

As part of the 30 for 3 campaign, for the 2023-24 season, Julius Randle has promised to donate \$500 for each three-pointer he makes to the Earl Monroe New Renaissance Basketball School in the Bronx.

This season Julius has converted on 76 3PT FG totaling \$38,000 for the school.

HARTENSTEIN SNATCHES 20 BOARDS FOR THE SECOND TIME:

Isaiah Hartenstein tied his career high after collecting 20 rebounds against the Grizzlies (Jan. 13). He also amassed 12 points, four blocks, and two steals. Hartenstein joins Rudy Gobert, Domantas Sabonis, and Andre Drummond as the only players to record 20+ rebounds on at least two different occasions this season.

Hartenstein is the first player this season to record 10+ points, 20+ boards, at least four blocks and at least two steals in a game. He is also the first Knick to record this stat line since Marcus Camby registered 21 points, 22 boards, two steals, and six blocks against San Antonio in 2002.

KNICKS WON FIVE STRAIGHT: After defeating the Trail Blazers, the Knicks won a season-high five consecutive games. Over those five games, the Knicks were ranked:

- 1st in Net Rating (19.8)
- 1st in Defensive Rating (100.2)
- 1st in Rebounding % (56.2)
- 1st in Second Chance Points (21.6)
- 1st in Opponent Points Per Game (97.4)
- 1st in Fast Break Points (21.0)

The Knicks are the first team in the NBA this season to allow less than 85 points and out-rebound their opponent by 12 or more. The last time the team accomplished this feat was 2022 vs Dallas. The Knicks allowed 84 points total and 41 points in the first half, the fewest points allowed in a game and in the first half of a game this season. The win against the Blazers, marks the third time in team history that the Knicks outscored their opponent by 28 points or more, allowed less than 85 points, and held an opponent to 39% or worse from the field and 21% or worse from three. The last time they accomplished the feat was 1992 vs Chicago.



PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Jalen Brunson earned NBA Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the second time this season, after leading the Knicks to a 4-0 record and averaging 27.3 points, 9.3 assists and 3.3 rebounds from January 1-6. Last week, Brunson tallied two 30+ point games along with a 29-point game. He also registered two 13+ assists games during this stretch.

KNICKS RECORD SEASON HIGHS IN PHILLY:

- Isaiah Hartenstein scored a season-high 17 points.
- Miles McBride recorded a season-high 15 points with four made three-pointers.
- Quentin Grimes tallied a season-high 19 points and eight rebounds which tied his career-high.
- Josh Hart collected his third double-double of the season amassing 10 points, and a season-high 15 rebounds.
- In the first half, the Knicks registered a season-high 75 points, and 14 made three-pointers.
- The Knicks recorded their highest margin of victory (+36 points).

ISAIAH CLEANS THE GLASS ON PRIMETIME: Isaiah Hartenstein grabbed a career-high 20 rebounds, scored 10 points, and recorded five blocks vs. Chicago on ABC. He is the fourth Knick in team history with 20+ rebounds, 10+ points, and five or more blocks in a game, joining Patrick Ewing, Marcus Camby, and John Gianelli. He is also the second player to accomplish the feat this season, joining Rudy Gobert. Since entering the starting line-up, Hartenstein (nine starts) is the only player in the NBA, to tally 30+ offensive rebounds, 25+ assists, 10+ steals and 10+ blocks.

<u>JULIUS' HOT STREAK:</u> Julius Randle recorded 39 points on 58.3% shooting and nine rebounds in a home win against the Minnesota Timberwolves (Jan. 1). He is now the fourth Knick in the last 40 years, to have five or more games of 30+ points on at least 55% shooting, and at least five rebounds in the first 33 games of a season. He joins Patrick Ewing, Bernard King, and Amar'e Stoudemire as the only Knicks to accomplish this over the last 40 years. Randle has now scored 20+ points in 19 consecutive games, which ranks eighth in Knicks history.

In the month of December, Julius totaled 386 points, 124 rebounds, 59 assists, while shooting 54.5% shooting from the field and 85.6% shooting from the stripe. He was one of two players (Giannis Antetokounmpo, Mil) to total 385+ points on 50%+ shooting, 120+ rebounds, 55+ assists in the month of December.

DONTE RECORDS CAREER-HIGH 38 POINTS: Donte DiVincenzo recorded a career-high 38 points on 71.4% shooting, seven made three-pointers, six rebounds, and four steals against the Indiana Pacers (12/30). He is now the third player in the NBA this season, to register at 35+ points, four+ steals, and at least seven made three-pointers in a game, joining Luka Doncic and Jalen Brunson.

<u>JALEN'S FIRST 30 GAMES:</u> Jalen Brunson recorded 24 points, seven assists, four rebounds, and two assists against the Thunder (12/27). He has accumulated 780 total points through the first 30 games of this season, which ranks fifth all-time in franchise history.

Brunson is also the first Knick, to record 780+ points, and 175+ assists in the first 30 games of a season in team history.

A CHRISTMAS WIN IN THE GARDEN: The Knicks had six double-digit scorers on Christmas Day for the 10th time in Knicks Christmas Day history, and second time in the Tom Thibodeau era (last 2022). Prior to 2022, the last time the Knicks had six double-digit scorers on Christmas Day was in 1979. The Knicks also scored a season-high 72 points in the paint vs. Milwaukee.

Jalen Brunson finished the game scoring 38 points while shooting 53.6% from the field, six assists and four rebounds. He has now registered 35+ points in back-to-backs for the first time this season, and he is also the first Knick to achieve this feat since he recorded back-to-back 35+ point games last season. In addition, Brunson has now tallied the third-most points scored on Christmas Day as a Knick, trailing Bernard King (60-1984) and Richie Guerin (40-1961).

Julius Randle recorded 24 points, nine rebounds, and two assists. He has now eclipsed 7,000 career points as a Knick in 313 games, which makes him the second-fastest Knick in team history to record 7,000 points, trailing only Carmelo Anthony who accomplished this milestone in 269 games.

BRUNSON HITS 35+ FOR THE FIFTH TIME: Jalen Brunson registered a team-high 36 points, while shooting 57.7% from the field and seven assists. He has now scored 35+ points on 55%+ shooting, and at least five assists in three games this season, which is tied for third in the NBA, trailing Luka Doncic (5), Nikola Jokic and Giannis Antetokounmpo (4). It was also Brunson's ninth game as a Knick with 35+ points, five or more assists, and three or more three-point field goals, breaking a tie with Julius Randle for the most such games in Knicks history.

<u>DONTE DROPS 20+ ON THE ROAD ONCE AGAIN:</u> Donte DiVincenzo amassed 23 points on 60% shooting, eight rebounds, three steals and five made three-pointers in a road win against the Brooklyn Nets (12/21). In addition, this is also his third game registering 20+ points, three+ steals, while shooting at least 60% from the field. ISAIAH HAS CAREER NIGHT ON THE GLASS: Isaiah Hartenstein played a season-high 39 minutes against the Lakers (12/18), and collected a career-high 17 rebounds, along with nine points, two steals, and two blocked shots. THE BIG 5-0: Jalen Brunson registered a career-high 50 points on 73.9% shooting (17-23), while also shooting a perfect 9/9 from deep, nine assists, and five steals against the Suns (12/15). He is now the first NBA player since Michael Jordan, to record 50+ points, nine+ assists, five+ rebounds, and five+ steals in a single game. Brunson is also now the first player since 2016 (Anthony Davis), and sixth player in NBA history, to record 50+ points, five+ steals, and five+ assists.

FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS: The Knicks were efficient against Phoenix (12/15), shooting 59.8% from the field, 58.6% from the three-point line, and 85.7% from the stripe. This marks the 12th time since 1979-80, and first time since 2012, that the Knicks recorded at least 55% from the field, at least 55% from deep, and at least 85% from the free throw line. The Knicks are also the third team this season to accomplish this feat, joining the Boston and Oklahoma City.

JULIUS BEBOPS HIS WAY TO 32 AND 12: Julius Randle tallied 32 points on 60.8% shooting, 12 rebounds, six assists, one steal, and one block against the Jazz (12/13). He is now the eighth Knick to record 30+ points on 60%+ shooting, 10+ rebounds, at least one steal, and at least one block in a game, in team history. Randle's strong performance also moved him up the Knicks' all-time leader board. His two made three-pointers at Utah (12/13), surpassed Jamal Crawford for the fourth most made threepointers in Knicks history and second quickest in team history to reach 600 made three-pointers.

IN SEASON TOURNEY - JULIUS DROPS 40+: Julius Randle went off for a season-high 41 points, six rebounds, five assists while shooting 73.6% from the field and 91.6% from the stripe against Milwaukee (12/5). He finished the first half scoring 25 points, without missing a field goal or free throw attempt, which makes him the fourth player since 1996 to record 25+ points and shoot 100% from the field and free throw line in a first half.

Randle has also totaled 429 points, 199 rebounds and 110 assists over the first 20 games of the season, which makes him one of two players this season to record 425+ points, 195 rebounds and 110 assists (Nikola Jokic, DEN). This also marks the second time in Knicks history, that a player has tallied at least 425 points, 195 rebounds and 110 assists in the first 20 games of a season. Randle recorded accomplished this feat in the 2020-21 season.

MITCH JOINS NBA HISTORY: Mitchell Robinson has been a force on defense and the offensive glass this season. He has amassed 101 offensive rebounds, 31 steals and 27 blocks in the first 20 games this season. He joins Andre Drummond as the only players since the 1973-74 season, to eclipse 100+ offensive boards, 30+ steals, and 25+ blocks in the first 20 games of a season.

JALEN DROPS 40 ONCE AGAIN: Jalen Brunson recorded 42 points, eight assists, six rebounds, seven made three-pointers, and one turnover vs. Detroit (12/1). He is the fourth player in NBA history to record 40+ points, eight or more assists, six or more rebounds, seven or more made three-pointers, and one or less turnover, joining Stephen Curry, Damian Lillard, and Kemba Walker. Brunson also became the fifth player in Knicks history to record two 40+ games in the first 18 games of a season, joining Bernard King, Patrick Ewing, Dick Barnett, and Al Harrington. He also is the eighth player this season to record two 40+ games in the first 18 games this season.

JULIUS JOINS NBA HISTORY: Julius Randle registered 25 points, 20 rebounds, five assists, and two made three-point field goals vs. Charlotte (11/28), becoming the first Knick in team history to record 25+ points, 20+ rebounds, five or more assists, and two or more made three-point field goals. Randle is also the 10th player in NBA history to accomplish the feat, joining Charles Barkley, Larry Bird, Dirk Nowitzki, Kevin Garnett, DeMarcus Cousins, Karl-Anthony Towns, Luka Doncic, Nikola Jokic, and Domantas Sabonis. In addition, Randle is also the first Knick to record 25 points, 20 rebounds, and five assists since David Lee (2010), and first Knick to record 20+ points and 20+ rebounds since Enes Freedom (2018). With 20 boards vs. Charlotte, Randle eclipsed 3,000 rebounds as a Knick and sits 19th on the Knicks' all-time rebounding list.

COMEBACK OF THE DECADE: The New York Knicks managed to mount a 21-point comeback in the second half vs. Miami (11/24/23). New York trailed 87-71 in the third quarter, when Jalen Brunson sparked the Knicks comeback. This marks the largest second-half comeback win for the Knicks, since 2004 when New York came back from a 26 point secondhalf deficit vs. Milwaukee (3/14).

MOVING UP THE REBOUNDING RANKS: Mitchell Robinson collected a season-high 11 offensive rebounds to go with 14 total rebounds at Charlotte (11/18/23), which moved him past former Knicks Bill Cartwright and Kurt Thomas for third in franchise history. He now trails Charles Oakley and Patrick Ewing.

ON FIRE FROM DOWNTOWN: The New York Knicks shot 43.7% from the three point line (16/37) in a road win at Charlotte. This marked the sixth consecutive game in which the Knicks have shot at least 40% from three, which is New York's longest streak within a single season using a minimum of 30 three-point attempts in each game.

DONTE'S BIG NIGHT IN BUZZ CITY: Donte DiVincenzo scored a careerhigh 25 points, while shooting 70% (7/10) from the three-point line. He also chipped in a season-high three steals. Jalen Brunson and Julius Randle also recorded 32 and 25 points respectively. This is now the third consecutive game, and first time this season, in which three Knicks have scored 20+ points (Last: March 1-5, 2023).

<u>GIVE ME THAT:</u> Mitchell Robinson is the eighth player in NBA history to collect at least 55 offensive boards through a players first nine games of a season, joining Moses Malone, Jayson Williams, Dennis Rodman, Andre Drummond, Paul Silas, Larry Smith and Dan Roundfield.
