FINAL ORDER OF CASE CLOSING

On September 14, 2009, a Department of Labor Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued an Order Granting Respondent's Motion for Summary Judgment in this case arising under the employee protection provisions of the Federal Rail Safety Act (FRSA).¹ The Department of Labor has not yet enacted regulations governing the procedures to be followed to obtain Administrative Review Board review of recommended decision and orders under the FRSA. Consequently, the ALJ referred the case to the Board for possible review.

In response, the Board issued an Order dated September 23, 2009, notifying the parties that if a party wished the Board to review the ALJ's Order, the party must file a petition for review with the Board no later than ten (10) business days from the date of the Order, requesting the Board to review the Order Granting Respondent's Motion for

Summary Judgment. The Order stated that the petition for review must specifically identify the findings, conclusions, or orders to which the party objected and that the Board will ordinarily consider any objection not specifically listed as waived by the party.

The Order cautioned the parties, "[i]f the Board does not receive any petitions for review within the ten (10) day period, the Board will issue an order closing the case, and the ALJ's Order will become the Secretary of Labor's final order." The Board has not received any petitions for review in response to our September 23rd Order. Accordingly, we **CLOSE** this case and the ALJ's September 14, 2009 Order is the Secretary of Labor's final order.
