NOTIFICATION TO PARTIES THAT CASE HAS NOT BEEN ACCEPTED FOR REVIEW

On April 4, 2012, the Complainant, Theron Carter, filed an appeal from a Department of Labor Administrative Law Judge's Decision and Order Dismissing Claim with the Administrative Review Board in this case arising under the under the Surface Transportation Assistance Act.¹ The Secretary of Labor has delegated her authority to consider an appeal of an Administrative Law Judge's order in a STAA case to the Administrative Review Board.²

The STAA's implementing regulations provide that the Board must notify the parties and the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) within 30 calendar days if the Board determines that it will review the ALJ's decision.³ The Board issued no such order in this case. Accordingly, the parties are notified that the case has not been accepted for review. Furthermore, the ALJ's March 2, 2012 Decision and Order has become the final order of the Department of Labor.⁴
