## Public Hearing August 22 for 3.0 MW Solar Plant Proposed for Montgomery County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are invited to comment on a proposal by Chaberton Solar Ramiere LCC to construct a 3.0 MW solar facility in Montgomery County. The virtual hearing will take place on **Thursday, August 22, 2024** at **7 p.m.** before Chief Public Utility Law Judge Chuck McLean.

In April 2024, Chaberton Solar Ramiere applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station or high-voltage transmission line in Maryland. According to the application, the solar facility, intended as part of Maryland's community solar program, would be built on 11 acres of a 118-acre property located at 17600 Whites Ferry Road, near the intersection with Sugarland Road, in Poolesville.

The hearing will include a presentation by the developer, followed by brief statements from other parties to the proceeding, including the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Maryland Office of People's Counsel, the Commission's Technical Staff, the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, and Montgomery County. At the conclusion of those brief statements, members of the public will have an opportunity to comment on the proposed project.
