

Ultimate Texas Hold'em® progressive features heads-up play against the dealer, an optional Trips bonus bet and a progressive bet. This game gives you several advantages:

- . The earlier you bet, the more you can bet.
- · You don't have to fold until you see all the community cards.
- The Trips bonus pays odds if your final five-card hand is a three-of-a-kind or better.

Getting Started

Make equal bets in the ante and blind circles. You may also make the optional Trips and progressive bets. You will then receive two cards.

Bet Big... or Small... or Not at All

When you get your two hole cards, you can either check or bet 3x-4x your ante. The dealer then reveals the three-card flop. If you haven't already made a play bet, you have a choice: check or bet 2x your ante. The dealer then reveals the final two community cards. If you haven't already made a play bet, you have a choice: fold or bet 1x your ante.

Winning & Losing

The dealer will reveal his two hole cards and announce his hand. If your hand beats the dealer's, your play and ante bets win even money. If the dealer's hand beats yours, your play, ante and blind wagers lose. If you tie, these bets push. The blind pays if your winning hand is at least a straight (see layout for odds). If you beat the dealer with less than a straight, it pushes.

Dealer Qualifying

The dealer needs at least a pair to qualify. When the dealer doesn't qualify, he returns your ante. All other bets receive action.

Bad Beat Bonus

You have two ways to win if you are involved in a bad beat with the dealer. The first is by losing with a three-of-a-kind or better and the second is by beating the dealer's hand of a three-of-a-kind or better.

Progressive Payouts

Progressive winners are determined from the player's two cards, and the first 3 community cards (the flop). The optional \$1 progressive bet wins if you have a three-of-a-kind or better. See paytable for odds. The top award—100% of the jackpot—pays when you have a royal flush. A straight flush pays 10% of the jackpot. Folded hands do not qualify for payouts on the progressive wager.

Top pays trigger envy bonuses. See paytable for payouts. You can win multiple envy bonuses in a round, but you cannot receive an envy bonus for your own hand or the dealer's hand.

Xtreme Hold'em is an exciting Texas Hold'em style game where the player and the dealer each receive two-hole cards and share five community cards to make the best five-card poker hand.





Make equal wagers on the Ante and X-tra Bonus to begin.



After receiving two-hole cards, the player can bet 3x or 4x Ante, or check. After seeing the three-card flop, the player can bet 2x Ante or check. After viewing the last two community cards, the player may bet 1x Ante or fold.



You may also make the optional Player Bonus and STAX Progressive wagers. The Player Bonus wager pays if your hand contains a Three-of-a- Kind or better.



The X-Tra Bonus is a mandatory wager that pays odds when you win with a straight or better.



The optional BONUS SPIN XTREME or STAX Progressive bet wins when a qualifying hand is made.
