

## **WRITE-IN CANDIDATE INFORMATION FOR NOVEMBER 5, 2024 GENERAL ELECTION**

**When and Where to File:** The deadline for submitting a write-in candidate declaration of intent is October 25, 2024 by 5:00 p.m. (second Friday before the November 5, 2024 election). (Section 115.453(4), RSMo.)

**Write-In Candidate:** A “write-in candidate” is a person:

- Whose name is not printed on the ballot (see Section 115.453(4) RSMo.); *and*
- Who has filed a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate for election to office with the proper election authority prior to 5:00 pm on the second Friday immediately preceding Election Day. It is not necessary to file a declaration of intent if there are no candidates on the ballot for that office. (Section 115.453(4) RSMo.)

**Documents Needed for Filing:** (Section 115.306, RSMo.)

- Proof of Identity – Voter identification card, Missouri driver’s license, birth certificate, or other form of certified identification.
- A copy of an affidavit (does not apply to candidates running for federal office) **filed** with the Department of Revenue. A copy of the form can be found at <https://dor.mo.gov/forms/5120.pdf> and information about this requirement is available at <https://dor.mo.gov/taxation/individual/candidates.html> (Section 115.306, RSMo.).

**Candidates for U.S. President:** In addition to the Declaration of Intent and proof of identity, the following documents are required for a presidential write-in candidate (Section 115.453(6), RSMo.):

- Listing of candidates for president, vice president, and presidential electors.
- Candidate declarations for each presidential elector (10 total, one qualified resident of each congressional district and two additional at-large candidates)

**Where to Submit Declarations of Intent:** Filings for federal office, statewide office, state senator, state representative, or circuit judge will be accepted at the James C. Kirkpatrick State Information Center located at 600 West Main Street in Jefferson City, Missouri.

Write-in candidates for a county office must file with the election authority of the county. (Section 115.453(4), RSMo.).
