

History Hub from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) is a crowdsourcing platform for historical research that is free and open to everyone. The History Hub is a community-driven resource connecting people with government agencies, researchers, and citizen archivists to help with their recordsrelated gueries. The platform covers a wide range of record subjects, from genealogy to presidential, military, court and land records.

Whether patrons are looking for information about their family history, researching a historical event, or trying to find a specific document, History Hub can help. Users can ask questions

### State Library Catalog Now Available

The wait is over! The new State Library catalog is now available, and library directors/branch managers may begin requesting items. With the new catalog comes changes on how to use your State Library card. These are highlighted in the Changes to Using Your Card section on the Find Books page of the Missouri Library Staff Guide. We also created a self-paced tutorial to help

and get answers from multiple sources, including National Archives staff, partner institutions, and a community of genealogists, history experts and public citizens.

History Hub tools offer discussion boards, blogs and community pages to connect experts with researchers. Patrons can also register with the Citizen Archivist Dashboard to help with transcription projects and enhance National Archive records by tagging records.



This open-call grant is a combination of the previously offered Author Visit Grant and the Bicentennial Programs Grant, and will replace the two separate grants. Libraries can apply to bring an author or educational presentation to their community. This application is open to Missouri public libraries certified to receive FY24 state aid, Missouri school libraries publicly supported and publicly controlled, and Missouri academic libraries supported publicly or privately.
