   111 capacity building activities
  - **68 virtual**
  - 17 hybrid
  - o 26 onsite
- Engaged 3,526 beneficiaries
- Engaged 122 Member States









## SPIB Capacity Building (1 Jun – 31 Sept 2021)

- In 1 Jun- 30 Sep 2021, SPIB delivered
   143 capacity building activities
  - 130 virtual (incl. joined office activities)
  - o 7 hybrid
  - 6 onsite (incl. joined office activities)
- Engaged 3,206 beneficiaries
- Engaged 61 Member States









### **Programmatic Highlights (UNCCT)**

- Victims Programme: Commemorated the 4th Victims Day, and the **20th Anniversary of 9/11** with the Memorial, 90 Member States and international organizations.
- Global PRR Programme: Launched the Global Framework for United Nations Support on Syria and Iraq Third Country National Returnees and dedicated Multi-Partner-Trust-Fund with Secretary-General.
- Gender & Human Rights: Finalized internal Gender Policy and Action Plan and launched human rights and borders guide with OHCHR
- Border Security Management: Expert Group Meeting in RoK on BSM Best Practices and COVID-19 (IOM, WCO, Smithson Centre)
- Regional Strategy Development: Developed 10-year review of GCTS in Central Asia for next phase of JPoA; continued support to the updated Arab CT Strategy in Oct in Dubai



### **Programmatic Highlights (SPIB)**

- Connect & Learn: Launched online portal providing access to resources and materials for UNOCT programmes, CoP, CT/PCVE courses
- CT and Aviation Security: Launched Programme on Threat Assessment Models for Aviation Security. Held first regional workshop with SADC and began technical assistance activities.
- Parliamentary Engagement Programme: Launched Programme Office in Doha. Co-organized, first Global Parliamentary Summit on Counter-Terrorism with IPU, UNODC.



- CT Investigations and Kidnap for Ransom (KFR): Officially inaugurated Rabat Programme Office, which will serve as a regional CT training hub. Revised and launched the UN Counter Kidnap and Extortion Manual.
- Mozambique: Conducted first mission to Mozambique to further identify priority technical assistance needs.



## **Countering Terrorist Travel Programme (CT Travel)**

**Donors:** Netherlands, EU, USA, Qatar, Australia, Japan, India, and Hungary

UNOCT's global flagship initiative with partners: CTED, UNODC, ICAO, OICT, and INTERPOL assisting 49 Member States

Objectives: To assist Member States in building capacities to prevent, detect, and investigate terrorist offences and other serious crimes, including their related travel, by collecting and analyzing passenger data and enhancing operational information exchange in accordance with SCRs 2178, 2396, 2482, international standards, relevant privacy laws and human rights principles

### **Comprehensive assistance provided on:**

- Needs assessment
- Legislative assistance
- Set-up of a PIU and delivery of training
- Establishing carrier engagement and connectivity
- Technical support and deployment of the UN 'goTravel' software



**49** Member states joined the Programme since its launch on 7 May 2019

**16** countries received assessments since Programme launch

**16** roadmaps, and **1** regional workplan with CARICOM developed since Programme launch

**19** countries (incl. 15 MS of CARICOM IMPACS) testing goTravel software


At least **8** national consultations for 2021 including Nigeria, Benin, Morocco, DRC



# **CT Travel Programme: Major achievements**







- 7 new Member States joined the CT Travel Programme since June: Niger, Kyrgyzstan,
   Tanzania, Switzerland, France, Tajikistan and Vietnam
- 1 national consultation in Iraq, 2 national API and PNR Roadmaps developed for Norway and Iraq
- UNOCT signed 2 MoUs with The Philippines in July and Mongolia in October and 1
   MoA with Botswana in October
- First regional API/PNR Awareness Session for Eastern African Member States


### **Operational / Technical**

- Further development of Maritime component
- goTravel test deployments: CARICOM, Cote d'Ivoire, Azerbaijan, Botswana and Norway
- Suite of training strategy developed and reviewed (including e-learning)
- Delivery of online training courses
- Cooperative Online Platform (COP) hosting 402 users and 45 national implementation pages, 6 regional Informal Working Group pages and Pool of 46 API/PNR Experts
- New partnership; support comprehensive border management
- Comprehensive long-term strategy relating to Human Rights
