#### **KEY ISSUES RAISED BY HEADS OF ENTITIES**

- USG Voronkov emphasized on strengthening and reinforcing of counter-terrorism cooperation and coordination, including through the Counter-Terrorism Compact
- UNAOC High Representative Mr. Moratinos highlighted that interfaith dialogue can be used as a tool to rediscover the commonalties between different faiths, celebrate diversity and respect the differences in beliefs and convictions
- UN High Commissioner for Human Rights informed the Security Council that the prospects for women peacebuilders are 'Vastly Worse' than before the pandemic
- CTED Acting ED Mr. Chen called for multilateral approach and collaboration among Member States, UN entities, regional organizations, and civil society
- INTERPOL CT Director Mr. Greg Hinds stressed that digitalization and new technologies must be integrated in crime and terrorism prevention strategies
