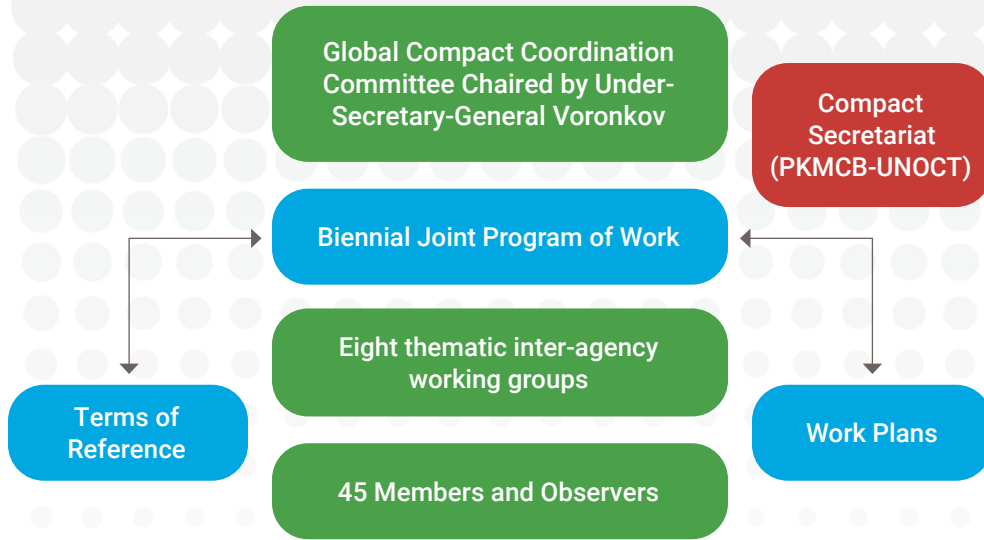

Preventing and combating terrorism

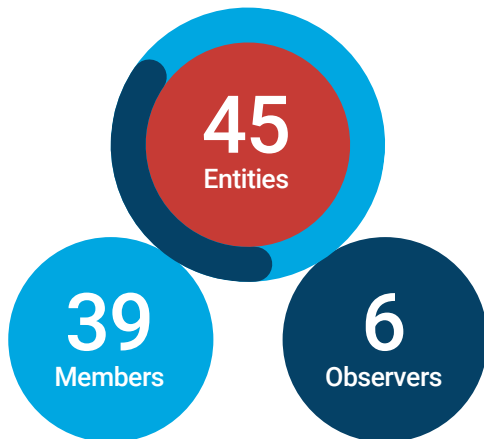
