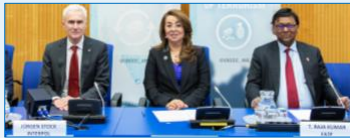

LEADERSHIP, COORDINATION, COHERENCE

KEY HIGH-LEVEL EVENTS

- UNODC, INTERPOL, and FATF organized a [high-level side event](#) during the 33rd session of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice in Vienna calling for urgent action to fight money laundering and terrorist financing (13 May)



- UN Women and Moldova co-organized a [high-level conference](#) "Women, Peace, and Security: Empowering Women, Building Peace and Security," with participation of UNICRI (21 May)

- UNODC [high-level side-event](#) held on the margins of the 2024 International Conference on Nuclear Security in Vienna

stressed the importance of implementing ICSANT (22 May)

- UNOCT and the Kingdom of Morocco organized the third [high-level meeting of Heads of African Counter-Terrorism and Security Agencies](#) (Marrakech Platform) on the evolving field of intelligence analysis and new technologies (4-5 June)



- CTED and Algeria co-hosted the [launch of two Trends Alerts](#) on counter-terrorism and border management in Africa (21 June)



KEY ISSUES RAISED BY HEADS OF ENTITIES

- OHCHR ASG Brands Kehris [stressed](#) that the protection and promotion of human rights, including advancing gender equality, are prerequisites for successful counter-terrorism (30 May)

- UNOCT USG Voronkov [highlighted](#) that responses to terrorism must adopt countermeasures 'as agile and as multifaceted as the threat', including comprehensive, tailored, and practical capacity-building programmes for African Member States (5 June)



- [Special Rapporteur Saul Underlined](#) that "national and regional oversight and accountability mechanisms play a vital role in effectively checking that counterterrorism actors respect human rights" (9 June)

- CTED ASG Gherman [emphasized](#) that the lack of implementation and coordination of legal and policy tools hampers progress in tackling destruction, looting, and trafficking of cultural property for terrorist purposes (12 June)



- UNOCT/UNCCT Director Miedico [noted](#) that the dark web "has become a breeding ground for malicious activities, providing a haven for terrorists and cybercriminals to converge, collaborate, and amplify their impact" (28 June)



ENGAGEMENT WITH MEMBER STATES

- UNOCT-US (ISN Bureau) briefed Member States from South and Southeast Asia on a [joint project](#) supporting CBRNE exercises to prevent/counter WMD terrorist threats (9 May)



- UNODC organized workshops for: Nigeria on forensic recovery for Police officers (6-10 May) and efforts to counter terrorism financing (3-7 June); Mozambique a [mentoring programme](#) on management and rehabilitation of terrorist detainees (14-15 May); and [Yemen](#) on inter-agency coordination for prosecution (9-11 June)

- UNOCT held an [Expert Group Meeting](#) in Morocco on Video Games and Violent Extremism through a law enforcement and intelligence approach (27 May)

- CTED-UNODC facilitated a [training](#) to enhance counter-terrorism oversight in the Maldives (29 May)

- INTERPOL [Global Geiger Conference](#) held in [Bulgaria](#) discussed good practices for information sharing in countering radiological crimes (27-30 May)



- UNOCT /UNCCT's Global Programme on PCVE launched its [Youth Engagement and Empowerment Programme](#) in Kenya (3 June)



- UNOCT CT Travel held a consultation for [Gaban](#) on API/PNR (21 June)



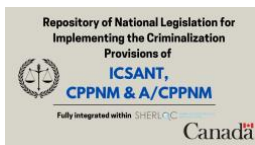
