LEADERSHIP, COORDINATION, COHERENCE

KEY HIGH-LEVEL EVENTS

- The [21st GCTF Coordinating Committee Meeting](#), co-hosted by Egypt and EU in Cairo, focused on [strategic priorities](#) and [future action](#) to counter global terrorism threats (4 May)



- UNODC organized a [high-level event](#) in Baghdad for the “Victims’ Voices, Silencing Terrorism” [campaign](#), which concluded the UNODC-AVT-L [project](#) for Iraq on supporting victims of terrorism (13 June)



- The [Third UN High-Level Conference](#) on Counter-Terrorism under the [theme](#) “Addressing Terrorism through Reinvigorated Multilateralism and Institutional Cooperation” (19-20 June); [40 side events](#) co-organized by over 95 stakeholders ([#CTWeek](#), 19-23 June)

- Morocco and OSAPG held a high-level event to commemorate the [2nd International Day for Countering Hate Speech](#) (19 June)

- UNOCT and the State of Qatar held their [Fifth High-Level Strategic Dialogue](#) (19 June)

KEY ISSUES RAISED BY HEADS OF ENTITIES

- CTED ASG Gherman [noted](#) that the CT Compact Platform has provided access to critical data in CTED assessments that better inform planning and implementation of technical assistance (31 May)

- [SG Guterres stressed](#) that through the CT Compact, the UN is providing practical, coordinated support to Member States, helping countries implement the Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy (19 June)

- [USG Voronkov underscored](#) that “the magnitude, complexities and evolving nature of terrorism require a robust and coordinated regional and international response” (19 June)

[UNODC ED Waly highlighted](#) that human rights must be front and center in our responses. This means due process, fair trials, humane prisons, respecting fundamental freedoms, and rehabilitating and reintegrating offenders into society (20 June)



- [ICAO SG Salazar called](#) on aviation security authorities and CT agencies to work together to put in place effective and sustainable security measures to safeguard aviation against terrorist attacks (23 June)

- [UNICRI Director De Meo stressed](#) that “youth involvement in shaping policies for the present and future is not merely symbolic, but rather necessary for sustainable and effective solutions across peace and development contexts” (23 June)

- [UN Women Director Hendriks emphasized](#) that women are still not meaningfully involved in all stages of decision-making, or significantly included and represented in security institutions (26 June)

- UN Women-CTED-Canada-Tunisia held an event on “Strengthening Inclusive Processes of the UN GCTS Review: Voices of Women-led Civil Society Organizations Discussion with Member States” (5 May)

- OSAPG [official visit to Brazil](#) to assess the risk of genocide/atrocity crimes against indigenous peoples, Brazilians of African descent & other groups at risk (1-12 May)

- CTED-Team of Experts on the Rule of Law and Sexual Violence in Conflict convened an [Expert Group Meeting](#) on SGBV acts in terrorist contexts (10-11 May)



- CTED conducted visits to [Republic of Korea](#) (22-25 May) and [Chile](#) (6-9 June) and [extensive consultations](#) on non-binding guiding principles on new technologies

- UNOCT and [Spanish Memorial Center](#) for the Victims of Terrorism opened a [Memories Exhibit](#) in Vitoria (7 June)



- UNOCT [Expert Group Meeting](#) in Rabat, Morocco, addressed Countering the Threat of Kidnap for Ransom (8 June)

- UNODC conducted workshops in [Maldives](#) (29-31 May) & [Turkmenistan](#) (13-14 June); a visit to [Brunei Darussalam](#) (27 June)

- Special Rapporteur on CT/HR issued a [report](#) on technical visit to U.S. (14 June)

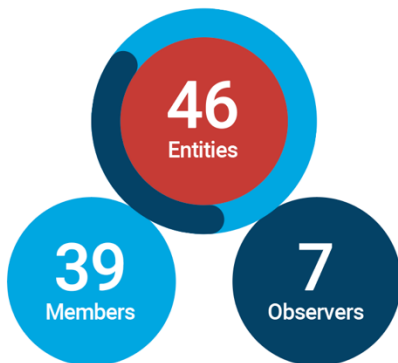


COUNTER-TERRORISM COMPACT STRUCTURE
