**Mr. President,**

Over the past year, the Security Council convened a number of thematic debates on post-conflict peacebuilding. The frequency of the meetings and the scope of the discussion testify to the growing sense of commitment by the Council to take into consideration the complex challenges facing countries emerging from conflict.

The Peacebuilding Commission could certainly help the Council to deepen this commitment by offering three main advisory functions:

**First:** an early peacebuilding perspective which could help the Council's consideration of the scope of the peacekeeping missions' roles in and contributions to the broader peacebuilding efforts undertaken by other actors in the field.

**Second:** an inclusive and flexible platform to forge partnerships and engagement with these key actors, thus ensuring broader buy-in to the peacebuilding processes and facilitate informed draw down of peacekeeping missions.

**Third:** Accompaniment of the countries on its agenda and monitoring of the progression from stabilization to consolidation of peace on the basis of country-specific analysis of risks and opportunities.

I welcome the initial steps taken by the Council so far to engage the chairs of country configurations in more interactive and informal dialogues around peacebuilding opportunities and challenges in certain countries on the PBC agenda.
