

Emperors Challenge Exposed

Emperor's Challenge Exposed is a commission free, house banked Pai Gow Poker based game using a standard 52 card deck plus one Joker. The object of the game is for the player to beat the dealer in both their two card low hand and their five card high hand.

Rules of play:

- 1. Each player must make an Emperor's Challenge Exposed wager and optionally make an Emperor's Treasure bonus, Pai Gow Insurance, Ace High Pai Gow Insurance or Progressive wager
- 2. The player's and the dealer receive seven cards which must be separated into a low two card hand and a high five card hand.
- 3. The dealer turns over and sets their five-card high and two-card low hand according to the House Way.
- 4. Each player must then set a two-card low hand and a five-card high hand and place each hand in their designated areas. The ranking of the five-card hand must be higher than the two-card hand.
- a. If the player's low hand and high hand are greater than the dealer's high and low hand the player's Emperor's Challenge Exposed wager is paid 1 to 1.
- b. If either the player's low hand or high hand is not greater than the dealer's high or low hand the Emperor's Challenge Exposed wager is a tie (push).
- c. If the dealer's low hand and high hand are greater than the player's low and high hands the Emperor's Challenge Exposed wager lose.
- 5. If the dealer's hand consists of Ace high Pai Gow all Emperor's Challenge Exposed wagers are a push. Emperor's Challenge Exposed wager pays 1 to 1

OPTIONAL WAGERS

Emperor's Treasure Bonus;

A player wins their Emperor's Treasure Bonus when their hand achieves a triggering event corresponding to the Emperor's Treasure Bonus pay table. The Emperor's Treasure Bonus also includes an Envy Bonus feature.

To qualify for an Envy bonus payout the player must make a wager of \$5 or more on the Emperor's Treasure Bonus wager and have another player's hand achieve a triggering event that corresponds with the Envy Bonus pay table. If a player is playing more than one hand they may qualify for an Envy Bonus payout on each of their hands. A player may not receive an Envy Bonus payout on the triggering hand or the dealer's hand.

Pai Gow Insurance

A Player wins their Pai Gow Insurance wager if their seven card hand is a Pai Gow (does not contain a pair or better). The Ace is always considered high and the Joker is always considered an Ace. This wager is paid according to the Pai Gow Insurance pay table.

Ace High Pai Gow Insurance

Players win if the dealer's seven-card hand is an Ace-high Pai Gow. The top award is achieved if the player and the dealer both have an Ace-high Pai Gow. Pays are based on the Ace High Pai Gow Insurance pay table.

Progressive Jackpot (BJS)

A player wins their progressive jackpot payout when they have placed a wager on the progressive prior to the delivery of cards and their hand achieves a qualifying payout corresponding to the Progressive Pay table.
